

12 INJURED IN WEEK-END LIST OF ACCIDENTS

Automobiles Figure in Nine of Ten Mishaps—Woman Hurt Seriously.

● CHILD AMONG VICTIMS

Twelve persons were injured in ten accidents over the week-end, according to reports to the police department. Of these, all but one were automobile mishaps. Those injured were:

MRS. SARAH WAGNER, 1456 Broadway, severe contusion of the skull.

MRS. WAGNER SUFFERS INJURY TO SKULL.

Mrs. Wagner, widow of Dr. Theodore Wagner, 1458 Broadway, was reported in a serious condition at the Indiana Hospital as a result of a head-on collision of a machine driven by her son, Dr. Herbert Wagner, in which she was riding and another driven by Celestine Cortes, 27, Filipina servant at the University Club, Saturday evening.

Mrs. Wagner was thrown from machine and picked up unconscious, suffering from contusion of the skull.

She had not regained consciousness early today and her condition was regarded critical.

Cortes was placed under arrest charged with assault and battery and driving on the left side of the street. Miss Emily Fletcher, 700 East Thirteenth street, who was in the machine, suffered a broken right wrist. Other occupants were not injured.

William Cosley, 1828 North Meridian street, was slightly injured when his machine hit that of Lester Meyers, 333 North Pennsylvania street.

Charles Tierce, 2164 Brooker street, had both legs broken when struck by an automobile at Madison avenue and McCarty streets. The driver of the car disappeared after taking Tierce to a nearby drug store.

TWO HURT BY THE COMPANY'S CAR.

Mrs. Maggie Allen, 234 South Capitol avenue, and A. Williams, living on South West streets, were severely hurt when struck by an automobile driven by Tony Maya, 28, an employee of a quick service tire.

49 ex-Criminals Found in Gotham Postal Service

NEW YORK, May 22.—Permanent use of United States marine troops to protect valuables in New York postoffices today was advocated by post officials from Washington, following rigid investigation of affairs here. It was announced forty-nine ex-criminals were discovered among workers recently added to the local force.

The revelation developed while investigation centered around the theft of \$1,477,000 worth of Liberty bonds from the mails.

SHOOTING OF MAN AND WIFE PUZZLES COPS

Accountant Killed by Unknown Assailant While Picnicing With Mate.

AURORA, Ill., May 22.—The mysterious circumstances surrounding the death of Eugene Hummer, an accountant, and the wounding of his wife, Mrs. Bessie Hummer, were puzzling the Aurora police today.

Hummer and his wife were picnicing in Fox River park Sunday and were sitting on a bench along the riverbank when a shot was fired at them. Hummer cried "I'm shot." Hummer sprang from the bench and as he did so a second bullet came from across the river and struck him. He died on the operating table at the Aurora general hospital. Mrs. Hummer's wound is not believed serious.

Police think the bullets may have been fired by fishermen along the river or perhaps may have been fired by some party of picnickers too plentifully supplied with "unmentionables."

Witnesses reported seeing two automobiles speeding away from the park soon after the shots were fired.

UNION MINERS LEAVING STATE

Officials to Consider Transfers of Many to Kentucky.

SULLIVAN, Ind., May 22.—Union miners of this section are disturbed by reports that miners from the Bicknell field are leaving in large numbers to take employment in Kentucky, where the union contract continues effective until 1923, and where operators have proposed a different interpretation of the terms of the strike. It is reported that a conference of union officials will shortly undertake to check the increasing number of Bicknell miners who are asking cards to enable them to obtain employment in Kentucky, where many of them worked before coming to Indiana.

Motor Truck Hits Telephone Pole

ANDERSON, Ind., May 22.—Kenneth Fowler, driving a truck carrying cattle, struck a telephone pole, which fell on Marion pile, and was severely injured.

Marion Muller, principal of the Summitville schools, who was with him, has both legs fractured, as a result.
