

BOOZETRAFFIC AT CLINTON TO GET ATTENTION

Federal Officers to Make
Further Probe Into Con-
ditions.

Further investigations into the liquor traffic at Clinton undoubtedly will be made by Federal officials following testimony given during the trial of the Clinton liquor conspiracy cases, involving twenty defendants, before Judge Albert B. Anderson in Federal Court.

It is not believed a special session of the grand jury will be called, but indications are the conduct of "higher ups" of Vermillion County will be investigated and taken up at the next session of the grand jury.

Final disposition of the cases of eight defendants who were found guilty by a jury in Federal Court Thursday and of five defendants who entered pleas of guilty will be taken by Judge Anderson June 23. The decision to defer action in these cases was made immediately after the jury reported its verdict of guilty.

Verdicts of guilty were returned against Paul Sandoz, sister of James "Big Jim" Sandoz, generally recognized as the head of the liquor ring of Clinton; Morris Cochran and John Burnett, of Indianapolis; and Martin Mohair, John Sasse, Peter Savio, John Buetto and Anton Pennoso of Clinton.

Pleas of guilty were entered by Carero, Fred Hatfield, Patrick Butler, Bill Davis and William D. Smith, the last four of Indianapolis.

Five defendants, Clarence Schultz, Homer Stocks, Addie Dicks, Floyd Kriner and Ollie Craig, all of Indianapolis, also entered pleas of guilty, but no action will be taken in their cases until they have completed sentences at the Indiana State Farm imposed on them in the State courts. The remaining two defendants are fugitives from justice.

During the trial, testimony was given to the effect that city officials of Clinton closed their eyes to the enormous liquor traffic being carried on openly that whole truck loads of white wine were loaded in broad day light and that there was little attempt at concealment of any of the transaction.

An entirely new note in sports costumes is to be found in this dress and slip-over coat, and employing two contrasting fabrics in the making.

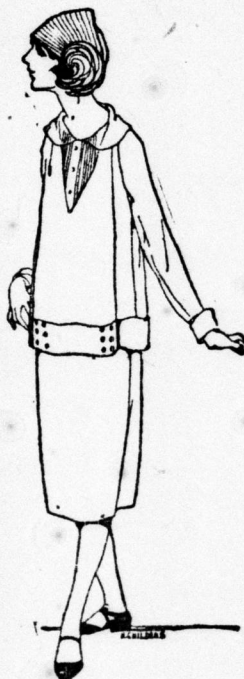
