"I'm going to put a stop to the ever increasing practice of young girls coming in here for letters which they don't want their parents to know they are receiving," Mr. Bryson declared. "Of course some of the girls who come in here may have a real reason for not having their mail sent home, but if they have, they will have to tell us all about it. And it is my opinion that a lot of them would rather not tell us."

"How do you account for the increase in calls from girls?" the postmaster was asked.

"I think it is just another indication of the desire for freedom from parental control, like bobbed hair and short skirts and other things that parents would not encourage—and that, as a result, the girls are all the more anxious to do," he said. "The young people of today seem to be possessed of the idea of getting away from any supervision from their parents. They want to dress as they please, go where they please and love whom they please, and if it isn't some one who pleases with father's or mother's approval they just keep still about it and get their love letters at the general delivery window. But there's a lot of them going to be disappointed, or at least discouraged, when this new system of questioning their reasons goes into effect."

"Some of them have already been asked for reasons, and to judge from results, they are hard-pressed for answers. For instance, here's one that said that 'Mail delivered by the carrier is unsatisfactory, due to several families living in this house.' Another says she lives in a rooming house and doesn't get all the mail that is sent to her."

"That is just about as much reason as most of them can give, too. 'But the flapper's aren't the only ones who try to use the general delivery window, as it was not intended to be used. Every once in a while I have calls from husbands who want me to keep their wives from getting mail here, and any number of wives want all their husbands' mail sent to the house, so they can see who it is from. One woman even wanted us to send her husband's office mail out home so she could look it over."

"Of course, we couldn't oblige her about that, nor would she have the right to open it—legally or morally—if she could get hold of it, any more than a husband has the right to open his wife's mail. But if we have reason to think that either of them is using the general delivery to avoid having their correspondence known, we will not hesitate to put a stop to it. The general delivery is intended for those who have no permanent address, and I don't intend for it to be used as a matrimonial bureau, either."
