

## URGES VOTERS FORGET PARTY AFFILIATIONS

'Units for Common Good of Nations,' Says Gunsolus.

### SEEKS ALIEN LAW CHANGE

Thinks Too Many Foreigners Are Parasites on Wealth of Country.

Urging the citizens of the State and the Nation to forget party lines and to unite for the common good of the Nation by "voting for the man, regardless of politics, who can stand the acid test of Americanism," the Rev. Charles H. Gunsolus, at the First Congregational Church Sunday night made a plea for real Americanism in the home, the church and in public office.

Taking as his subject "Fundamentals of Americanism," the Rev. Mr. Gunsolus dwelt at length on the problems of immigration.

Million Aliens Yearly

"Each year approximately a million aliens come to our country, educated and along the right channels they make good citizens," he said. "If they are left to themselves, they never learn our language or our civilization."

"Many of the immigrants come to better their economic conditions, to gather money and then go back to their native land and live in comparative affluence. They are parasites who are eating out and undermining the fundamentals of our country."

Haven't American Ideals

He asked, "Why should Americans permit themselves to be swamped, overwhelmed, outvoted and ruled by those who are not at heart imbued with the ideals which animated the founders of this Nation, but who swarm into this country like rats, to gorge and destroy. They should be put out and kept out. Not only should the lid be clamped on more tightly but the deportation laws should be revised, making it easier and speedier to send the undesirable out of the country."

### ILLS MUCH ALIKE

M. E. Preacher Says Body and Spirit Have Same Diagnosis.

Spiritual and physical ills may be diagnosed in the same way, the Rev. J. H. Doddridge said in his sermon on "The Science of Health or the Art of Always Being Well," at the Maple Rd. M. E. Church.

"In diagnosing a case of spiritual health the spiritual appetite should be examined," he said. "If we find a hunger and thirst after righteousness, we may feel assured of the spiritual safety of the patient."

### DREAMS ARE NEEDED

Man of Wide Awake Vision Succeeds, Says Sidenor.

Dreams are a necessary part of achievement, Merle Sidenor told members of the Christian Men Builders of Indianapolis yesterday.

"It is the man of wide awake vision who is successful," he said. "Alexander Graham Bell saw a vision of country criss-crossed with wires before he perfected the telephone. The man who fails to follow his mental pictures is disrupting the scheme of things."

### CHRIST WAS REGULAR

Not Like Those Who Attend Church Only at Special Times.

"He was not like some people who come to church for weddings or funerals, or once a year on Easter Sunday. Our Lord Jesus Christ made church attendance habitual," declared Dr. Matthew F. Smith, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, in his sermon Sunday on the religious habits of Jesus Christ.

"The Lord Jesus Christ points the way to the normal, reasonable religious observances," the Rev. Mr. Smith said.

said in his sermon at the Meridian St. M. E. Church yesterday. "The soul is incomparably valuable for three reasons," he said. "In the first place Christ gave His precious blood to redeem it. Secondly, it is valuable for its immense possibilities, for it has the power of will, judgment, sin, purity, suffering, joy, worship and education. Thirdly, it has immortality."

Pastor Says Ills Can Be Cured Only by Christian Spirit.

"In the mad rush to get ahead we trample on the weak, neglect the poor, the aged, the suffering, only to applaud the winners of goals. In doing this, we are in direct violation of the spirit of Christ."

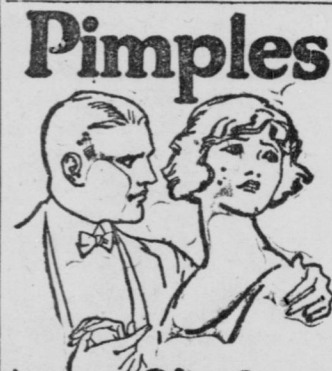
### Burglars Driven Off
