

## COURT OUTLINES POWERS OF U. S. RAILROAD BOARD

Decides Indirect Questions of  
Carriers Are Under Its  
Authority.

RULING AFFECTS STRIKE

Held to Be Victory for Unions  
as Well as Labor  
Body.

CHICAGO, July 21.—The United States railroad labor board has the power not only to set wage and working rule conditions on railroads, but to make decisions on cases dealing indirectly with these questions, according to a decision of the Circuit Court of Appeals here late Thursday. This decision will have an important bearing on the present railroad strike as the original dispute involved the forming of a "company union" by the Pennsylvania Railroad, which refused to meet union officials of the federated shop crafts. The Pennsylvania road insisted it had the right to deal with its own employees and sought by injunction to restrain the labor board from criticizing its action. The decision is not only a victory for the labor board, but is held to be an important victory for the unions. The Pennsylvania Railroad has recently announced it has come to a wage agreement with its shop employees. This agreement is invalidated because the labor board found the road was dealing with representatives of less than 15 per cent of its employees and had not considered the sentiments of the other 85 per cent.

STERLING PESSIMISTIC

Acting Governor of Illinois Plans Conference With Union Leader.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., July 21.—Acting Governor Sterling of Illinois today informed President Harding that he seriously doubted whether "such men can be had in sufficient numbers to justify the hope of a general resumption of normal coal production in this State in the absence of a settlement of the entire controversy in Illinois."

In the hope of such a settlement, Sterling is planning to confer with Frank Farrington, president of the

United Mine Workers in Springfield tonight.

Illinois public utilities have an average of forty-seven days' supply of coal as compared with forty-one days' supply on hand in February, according to H. M. Slater, of the public utilities commission.

Three miners' locals in Sangamon County have gone on record, endorsing President John L. Lewis' ultimatum that engineers and pumpmen would be withdrawn if an attempt was made to operate mines.

TROOPS GUARD MINES

Pennsylvania Proceeds Under Plan  
Advocated by President.

fields. Eleven hundred troops of the Pennsylvania National Guard, equipped for modern warfare, were rushed into five western counties to protect workers and save the nation from a serious coal famine this winter.

BUILDING IS ON INCREASE

June Report Shows Gain of 30 Per  
Cent Over May.


Building contracts awarded during June in Indiana amounted to \$12,845,700, according to the F. W. Dodge Company, who issue construction reports. This was an increase of 30 per cent over May and of 14 per cent over June, 1921.  
Included in the June total were the following items: \$3,849,800, or 30 per cent, for educational buildings; \$2,-

886,600, or 21 per cent, for public works and utilities, and \$1,805,300, or 14 per cent, for residential buildings.  
The June figures brought the total for the first half of this year up to \$59,246,000, an increase of 26 per cent over the corresponding period of 1921. The six months' total included \$9,104,200, or 15 per cent for residential buildings.




