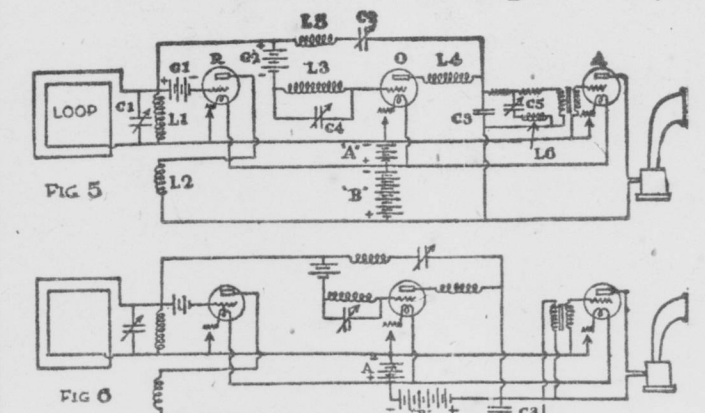

Audio-Frequency Amplifier Is Third Tube in Super Outfit

This is the seventh of a series of articles on the Armstrong super-regenerative receiver.

A combination of three tubes may be used in the super-regenerative receiver circuit.

The third tube acts as an audio frequency amplifier and is coupled to the plate circuit of the controller or oscillator tube through an audio frequency transformer.

Where this arrangement is used, the filter circuit becomes essential, for the received signals are very powerful. Any of the high pitched oscillations generated by the circuits of the tube O will be amplified to the point where they may completely mar the voice or music.

It is not easy to construct the filter circuit.

The resistances, R1 and R2, should be non-inductive and have a value of 10,000 to 15,000 ohms each. They may be purchased from a supply store in the form of carbon resistance rods, or they may be one of the several special types of resistance units such as the lavite units used by the Western Electric Company.

Condenser C5 should be variable of a maximum capacity of .005 MF. This is a fairly large variable unit and rather expensive.

The inductance, L5, is an iron core
