GERRYFLAPPER—A Barlow who thinks she looks like Geraldine Farrar.

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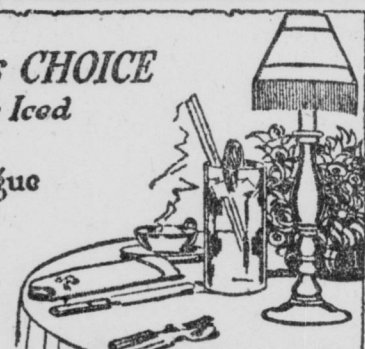

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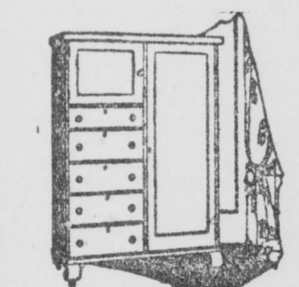

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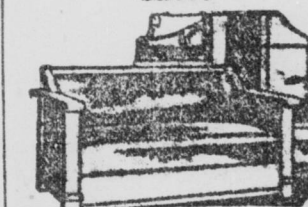


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
