

ROSE GARDEN IN PARKS IS PLANNED

Indianapolis Keeping Apace
With Other Cities in Beautifi-
cation, Jarvis Says.

"I believe that Indianapolis is doing equally as well as any city in the Middle West in regard to boulevard construction and park beautification," said R. Walter Jarvis, superintendent of public parks, today. Mr. Jarvis has just recently returned from a session of the American Conference of park executives, held in Minneapolis. The conference adopted a resolution for the establishment of a rose garden in every public park. Houston Toll has put in a large garden of roses in Garfield Park.

Mr. Jarvis said that he was heartily in favor of the mayor's and park board's plan for a suitable artificial lake.

Sixty Per Cent of Engines Found Defective in Government Inquiry

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—Reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission indicate that sixty per cent of the Nation's locomotives have been rendered defective as the result of the shopmen's strike.

This was revealed in a special report to the Senate by the Interstate Commerce Commission on the deterioration of rail equipment.

Ratio Applies Generally
Of 4,085 locomotives inspected at 717 different points, 2,456 or approximately 60 per cent of the engines were found defective and the commission expressed the opinion that this ratio would apply to all the 70,000 locomotives in the country.

The report was in response to a senatorial resolution, recently passed. Notices were served upon the carriers operating unsafe locomotives that they were violating the Interstate Commerce act and demanded

that the equipment be withdrawn from service.

Boiler Inspection Abandoned
Carriers are not making boiler inspection as required by law and considerable unsafe equipment is being operated, the commission stated. "Reports from our inspectors indicate a very general let down in the matter of inspection by the carriers which gives cause for concern," the report said.

The carriers reported they had been unable to make the inspection because of the strike.

KEEPING IN TOUCH IS U. S. ATTITUDE

Threatening Situation in Europe Object of Watch at White House.

It was indicated that no immediate move on the part of this Government is contemplated, but that eventually a way will be found by which the United States can aid in relieving the situation.
