

BANKER'S WIDOW IS DEAD IN EAST

Mrs. Anna Wallace Hughes, 63,
Passes Away at Home of
Daughter in New Jersey.

Mrs. Anna Wallace Hughes, 63,
widow of the late William A. Hughes,
who was vice president of the
Fletcher American Bank until his
death in 1911, died at the home of
her daughter, Mrs. De Witt Brockway,
in Plainfield, N. J., yesterday, ac-
cording to announcement made by
family members here.

Mrs. Hughes was the daughter of
William Wallace, one-time postmas-
ter of Indianapolis, and law partner
of President Benjamin Harrison, and
a granddaughter of David Wallace,
eighth Governor of Indiana. Lewis
Wallace and Col. William Wallace,
U. S. A., retired, are surviving broth-
ers.

Complete funeral arrangements
will not be announced until the funeral
party arrives in Indianapolis late to-
day.
