

Mussolini Like English Leader

New Italian Premier Moves After Fashion of Fighting Lloyd George.

ROMA, Nov. 2.—Italy's new Fascist premier, Benito Mussolini—the Lloyd George of Italy—may make his first bow on the international stage at the forthcoming Near East peace conference at Lausanne.

Displaying many of the characteristics of England's recent premier, Mussolini, like Lloyd George, is a strong believer in playing the give and take game of European diplomacy first hand, and not by proxy.

Mussolini revealed his unconventional manner of doing things by his caustic message to Count Sforza, the Italian ambassador at Paris, who had notified the premier he desired to resign, feeling he was not in complete accord with the Fascist government.

LABORITES LOSE IN MANY PLACES

Conservatives Are Predicting Overwhelming Victory in British Election.

LONDON, Nov. 2.—David Lloyd George, ill with a cold and sore throat, will be back campaigning by Saturday, his physicians declared today.

Conservatives today predicted overwhelming victory at the general elections as the result of yesterday's municipal elections. In eighty provincial boroughs the laborites lost 188 seats and the Conservatives gained 161.

Labor representative councils were completely wiped out in many places. Of eight London districts which labor formerly controlled five were lost and majorities in three were reduced.

FIGHTS DISEASE

Embargo Asked on Canadian Wheat Shipments

CHICAGO, Nov. 2.—A demand for an immediate embargo on Canadian wheat which is spreading rapidly among American grain interests in the Middle and Northwest was revealed here Tuesday when the American Farm Bureau Federation was asked to join other Middle Western interests in requesting the Interstate Commerce Commission to place an embargo on all Canadian wheat shipments through this country at once.

Farm Bureau officials are investigating the alleged strangling of American grain movements by Canadian shipments carried over American lines to eastern seaboard points for export and are expected to decide within the next two days whether to push the request for an embargo. The United States Grain Growers, Inc., is also waiting for complete statistics on Canadian and American grain movements.

EX-CONVICT HELD IN KIDNAPING CASE

Confession of Assault on 12-Year-Old Victim Secured by Police.
