

## LEADER OF LABOR PROMISES BATTLE

Ramsay MacDonald Serves Notice on Premier Bonar Law of His Purpose.

LLOYD GEORGE IS PLEASED

Liberals See Victory for His Leadership in Welshman's Present Position.

LONDON, Nov. 22.—The selection of Ramsay MacDonald as leader of the labor opposition in the House of Commons is tantamount to serving of notice on the Tory government of Premier Bonar Law that it must engage in a final fight.

MacDonald was a pacifist during the war but is one of the most radical men in English politics. He was sent to Parliament from Aberavon, Wales. In the first election after the war MacDonald's constituency rejected him because he had opposed the draft and was the mouthpiece of conscientious objectors.

Lloyd George Followers Happy Supporters of David Lloyd George were jubilant over labor's decision to pin its hopes in MacDonald. Many Liberals were of the opinion that the selection of MacDonald was a victory for the "Welsh wizard" who can now tell the country that it must accept him and his middle-of-the-way course if it wants a constructive government—one whose efficiency is not ruled by bitter wrangling in Parliament between Tories and Radicals.

## TIGER SEES PLOT TO RESTORE BOCH

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—America's answer to Georges Clemenceau's plea that she return to the side of France to preserve world peace was conveyed to the "father of victory" today in reports on the first editorial comment and other expressions of opinion of his speech at the Metropolitan Opera House.

Clemenceau's speech, delivered before an audience of four thousand, including many of America's best minds, leaders in business, finance, politics and other fields, was regarded as one of the frankest declarations on record concerning international relations.

He warned that German monarchists such as Ludendorff and Hindenburg are preparing to overthrow the government and establish a monarchy—a prelude to further wars. The great war, he said, was as much the affair of America as of France, but the United States left before the whole matter was cleared up. "France has been disappointed in the results of peace," he said. If French had foreseen that Germany would pay no reparations and would have marched on to Berlin, Clemenceau said, adding that General Foch's wish would have gone with him.

## POLICE HUNT FOR ONE AUTO; FIND ANOTHER

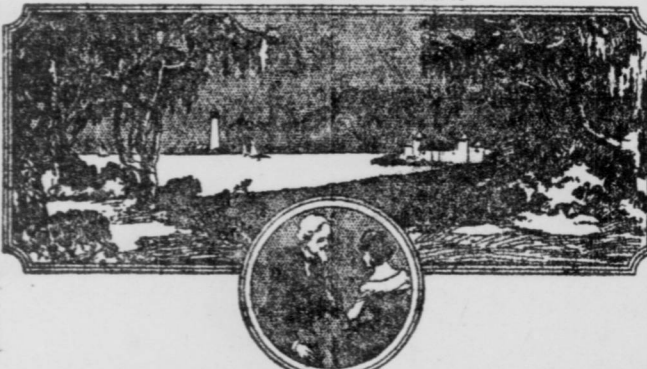

## 'Thou Shalt Not Kill' Warns Pastor to Speeders at Little Child's Funeral

CLEVELAND, Nov. 22.—Seven-year-old Catherine Gilmore was buried Tuesday afternoon and at her funeral were five motorists, convicted of violating traffic laws. They were serving a sentence imposed on them by Traffic Judge Sawicki.

They heard the Rev. W. P. Haggerty deliver a sermon upon "Thou Shalt Not Kill."

Upon pronouncing sentence Judge Sawicki said: "You are guilty of violating the traffic law. You are ordered by this court to attend the funeral of Catherine Gilmore, 7 years old. She was killed by a motor car. I am not passing this sentence because you are guilty of any infraction of the law other than which you are charged."

"I am acting because I feel that I must bring home to you the seriousness of careless driving. If, by my action, one child's life is saved, it is worth while."

The Rev. Haggerty said: "My friends, are we not forgetting the laws of God? The fifth commandment says, 'Thou Shalt Not Kill' and no modern invention gives us power to make exceptions to the commandment of God."

"It is not my intention to blame the man who unfortunately contrived, to this child's death. I understand he did his best to avoid the accident."

"But things have come to a pretty pass when children and old folks are not safe in crossing the streets."

Silent, with bowed heads, the five drivers stood in the rear of the church under police guard and listened to the sermon. Eyes of 300 children were turned upon them at intervals.

After the sermon the drivers were taken back to court.

"Did you see the body of this child in the casket and her father and her mother?" the judge asked.

"The five answered in the affirmative."

"Well," inquired the court. "We are cured, Judge," announced a spokesman for the five. "We'll never be before you again."

"There have been 117 such burials in Cleveland this year," the judge said. "That's all, men."

The residence of Frank Head, 2441 Manlove Ave., was destroyed by fire last night. Sparks on the roof started the fire.

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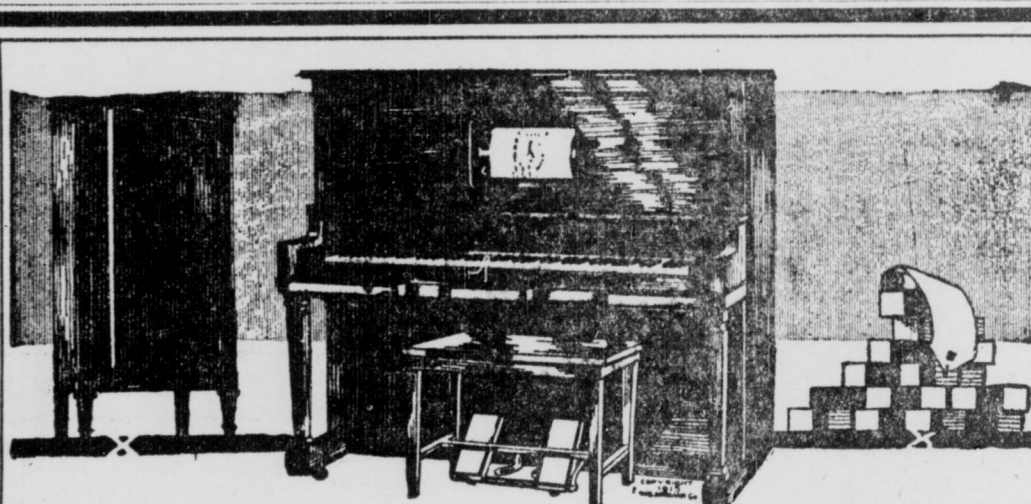
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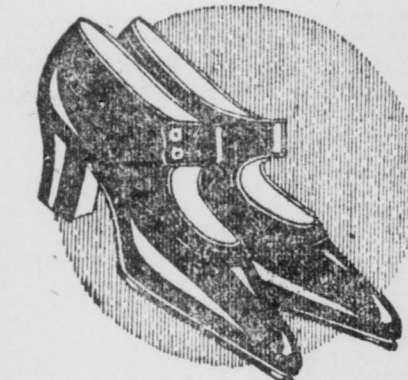
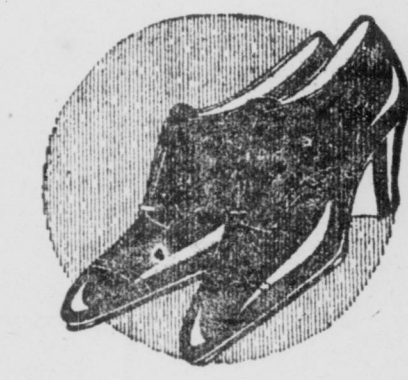
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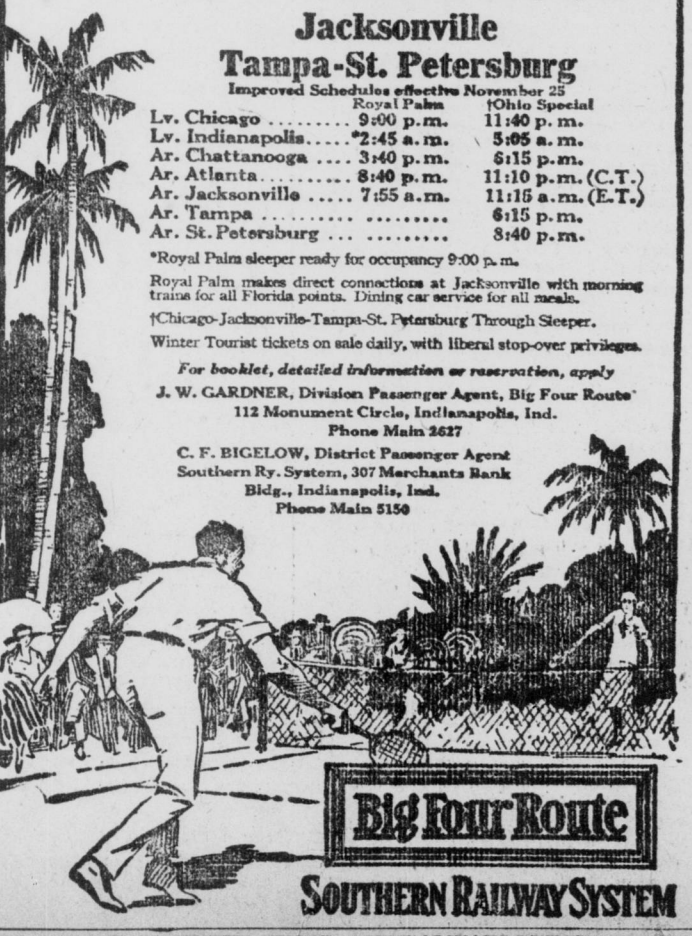
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
