

## FOES OF SCHOOL PLANS WILL GO TO STATE BOARD

Appeal to Tax Commissioners  
Planned to Hold Up  
Program

COST TO BE \$1,750,000

Architects Selected for Eight  
Buildings—Similar Move  
Made Year Ago.

Foes of the building program of the board of school commissioners will carry their fight to the State board of tax commissioners, it became known today.

In an effort to relieve overcrowded housing conditions now existing in the public schools, the board recently adopted a program calling for new buildings and additions at eight schools. The maximum cost of the buildings will be about \$1,750,000, according to estimates made by Jacob Hilkene, inspector of construction for the board.

Architects were selected and preparation of plans now is under way. Before bids can be received the school board must obtain the approval of the State board of accounts to the plans and specifications and the bond issue must be approved by the State board of tax commissioners.

On remonstrance of ten taxpayers the tax board is required to grant a public hearing.

More than a year ago construction of four buildings was defeated when the tax board refused to approve the bond issue after a long drawn-out hearing. In this case the remonstrance was signed by ten members of the Taxpayers League of Indiana.

## AMERICA MAY SWAY CONFERENCE

LONDON, Dec. 7.—America is expected to dominate the conference of allied premiers next Saturday in much the same manner as the United States made its voice heard at the peace conference at Lausanne, according to British officials.

Ambassador Harvey's speech at the Lyceum Club Monday night, in which he declared the fate of Europe hung upon the forthcoming week-end conference, was inadequately reported and officials here are just beginning to discuss it.

Considerable importance in this connection is attached to the arrival here of United States ministers to Brussels and Berlin.

Referring to the Brussels project, Ambassador Harvey said: "If the premiers themselves are unable to agree, it is useless to expect results from a meeting of a few under-strappers at Brussels."

According to reliable information obtained from British sources, Premier Poincare does not welcome contemplated American participation in the London conference. It is said that Poincare and his government are likely to go under if the premiers fail to reach agreement.

Ambassador Harvey may play a role similar to that of Richard Washburn Child at Lausanne.

## FRANCE MAKES NO MOVE TO PAY DEBT

Refuse to Negotiate With Regard to \$3,844,132,250 Owning U. S.

PARIS, Dec. 7.—The French government has so far declined to enter into any negotiations for the funding or payment of the \$3,844,132,250 debt France owes America, according to a statement by Elliott Wadsworth, assistant secretary of the treasury, at secret hearings held by the House Appropriations Committee.

The statement was revealed today at the climax of former Premier Clemenceau's visit to Washington.

## ASSERTS CAR CO. WOULD AID CITY

Attorney Speaks for Traction  
Co.'s Power Plant Scheme.

"This is the first time I have ever known the Indianapolis Street Railway Company to propose to do anything for the benefit of the public," J. W. Becken, farmer and lawyer, said today in a voluntary statement during the oral arguments on the petition of the T. H. I. & E. Traction Company for authorization to supply power to Indianapolis factories and to the Indianapolis Street Railway Company. The two companies are associated.

This statement followed that of Dr. Henry Jameson, president of the board of directors of the Indianapolis Street Railway Company, that the company was facing a serious situation with regard to its power supply which was important to uninterrupted service to Indianapolis.

The petition of the traction company asks a certificate of public necessity and convenience which would grant authority to invest approximately \$7,000,000 in additional power equipment to give greater service to the local company and in addition serve a number of large power users who it claims are dissatisfied with the service being rendered by the two existing utilities, the Indianapolis Light and Heat Company and the Merchants Heat and Light Companies.

Taylor E. Groninger, corporation counsel for Indianapolis; William L. Taylor, who represents large power users; Dr. Jameson, representing the street car company; William H. Hart, representing the Portland Cement Company at Limeville, a user of current, and J. W. Becken argued in support of the petition.

## LACK OF PAPERS DELAYS SCHOOL CONTRACT PROBE

Hogue Orders Snider & Rotz Not Be  
Paid Until Baker Approves.

The investigation of the claim of Snider & Rotz for \$25,000 for services in public school construction, ordered by City Controller Joseph L. Hogue, was held up today by failure of the school board to send to the controller's office papers in connection with the Snider & Rotz controversy, Hogue said.

Hogue has instructed Arthur Thomas, deputy controller and school board auditor, not to pay the claim, although the board has approved it, unless Albert Baker, school board attorney, advises in writing that the check is issued.

## DAUGHERTY CASE MAY DRAG TO ISSUE IN 1924

Indications Are Proceedings  
Will Be Incomplete by  
Next March.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—Impeachment proceedings against a member of the President's Cabinet are slow affairs, those who are working for Attorney General Daugherty's ouster are discovering.

Indications now are that the case against the Attorney General will drag out until it becomes a campaign political issue two years hence, despite Representative Volstead's promise as chairman of the House Judiciary Committee to speed action on the Keller charges.

The Daugherty case will not be settled during the remaining three months of the short session of Congress. Regardless of the verdict of the House Committee, is the impeachment proceedings will be incomplete when the Congress adjourns next March 4.

To prove each specification in the bill of particulars many witnesses will be examined and there will be inevitable delays. If the House committee agrees with Mr. Keller that the Attorney General should be impeached a recommendation to this effect will go to the House of Representatives. Then the House will determine if it will recommend to the Senate that Daugherty be tried before the Senate. Should the House so decide, another long delay will be had in the Senate which will conduct the case as deliberately as it pleases.

## FOUR CHILDREN DIE IN FLAMES

CHICAGO, Dec. 7.—Four children were killed and two others seriously injured when fire destroyed the home of Joseph Budack.

Four others, seriously injured, were rushed to the hospital. The fire was caused by a kerosene lamp which was left burning near an open window. Apparently the wind blew the curtain into the window.

The family was asleep upstairs. Michael Budack, 16, was awakened by the smoke. He shouted to his father, who jumped from a window and gave the alarm.

When the fire department arrived the interior of the cottage was a mass of flames.

Firemen rushed into the inferno. Three children were found dead in one room.

The mother, clasping Baby Eva to her breast, lay unconscious in the hall. She was rushed to the hospital where her condition is grave. The baby was still living when rescued, but died a few minutes later.
