len Poe. "I have tried to cure him of it, but I cannot. Last night at our hotel he became ill. I went for a doctor. When I returned they had taken him away."

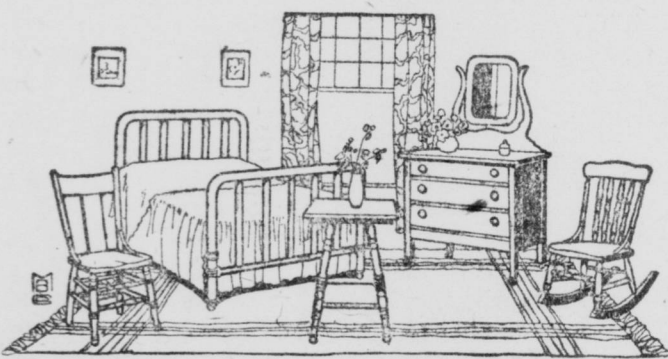
