

MOTORISTS, HERE IS TRAFFIC CODE IN EFFECT TODAY

All Turns Are Prohibited at Washington and Meridian.

PARKING TIME LIMIT CUT

Flat-to-Curb Rule Stays Preferential Streets Named.

The new traffic ordinance, passed by city council several weeks ago, becomes effective today. It takes precedence over all previous existing rules and police orders.

Outstanding features and principal changes:

Traffic approaching from the right has the right-of-way. Exceptions: Traffic has the right-of-way on all boulevards of the park system; on Indiana, Kentucky, Massachusetts and Virginia Aves; on E. Tenth, E. Michigan and E. New York Sts., from the Big Four Railroad tracks east to Emerson Ave.; on Morris St., between Shelby St. and Eagle Creek, and on W. Michigan St. and Oliver Ave., from White River west to the city limits.

Flat to Curb

At all "silent policemen," traffic from the right has preference. It is unlawful to cut corners at any street intersection.

Flat-to-curb parking is provided for unless otherwise specifically stated. No left turns are allowed at intersections of Washington St. with Pennsylvania, Meridian and Illinois Sts. and Capitol Ave. No right or left turn at Meridian and Washington Sts. It is unlawful to turn in the middle of the block in the congested areas or to back into the street within fifty feet of an approaching vehicle.

Preferential Streets

Washington St. is a preferential street for its entire length. Other streets where traffic must come to a full stop before entering are Capitol Ave., from Washington St. to Maple Rd.; N. Meridian St., Maple Rd. and E. New York St., from the Big Four Railroad bridge to Emerson Ave. and all boulevards.

In the congested areas and on Washington St. from East to West Sts., time limit parking is one and one-half hours. Instead of a limit of two hours, as before, on Monument Circle, the time is the same as for the congested districts. The limit around the market house on market days is thirty minutes.

Where the center of the street is reserved for parking, time limit at the curb is fifteen minutes. On Circle and around market house on market days, right angle parking at the curb will continue in use.

No Parking

No parking is permitted on the west side of Pennsylvania St., from Washington to Court Sts.; in front of the Claypool; alongside the Occidental building, Roosevelt building or Merchants Bank building; in any alley or one-way street in downtown districts north on Thirteenth St. from Fall Creek to White River; north side of Sixteenth from the Monon Railway to Senate Ave.; south side of Forty-Second St., from Carrollton Ave. to Broadway; east side of Clifton St., between Roach and Thirty-Fourth Sts.; north side of E. New York St., between Randolph and Emerson Aves.

Ten hours is the time limit at any point. Don't park within twenty-five feet of the entrance of any hotel, theater, church or public meeting place or within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant.

Age Limit 13

It is unlawful to tow vehicles at greater distance than fifteen feet apart. When parked legally no front light is required. It is unlawful to stop anywhere with left side of vehicle to the curb or to stand or park parallel to safety zone. There are no time restrictions on parking between 7 p. m. and 8 a. m.

All drivers of motor vehicles must be at least 18.

The provision for no turn at Washington and Meridian Sts. may be changed if it proves impractical.

ACCOUNTS BOARD PROGRAM REVIVED AFTER PRESSURE

Both Houses Resurrect Measures Widening Powers of Bureau.

Following strong lobbying on both sides of the question, both Houses have revived bills to give increased power to the board of accounts and two bills, slightly conflicting in their provisions, were on their way to passage.

The House, several days ago, voted to postpone indefinitely a bill giving the board of accounts power over road and school contracts on petition of ten taxpayers. The bill had previously passed the Senate. These powers had been assumed by the board, but the Appellate Court held some time ago they were without warrant of law.

It was after this bill had been postponed that the lobby for the board of accounts was strengthened. As a result, a bill was introduced in the Senate giving the same powers to the board on petition of twenty-five taxpayers.

Almost simultaneously, Wednesday afternoon, the two Houses started working on the bills. After a hard fight and a parliamentary tangle, the House suspended the rules and recalled to life the bill previously indefinitely postponed.

Meanwhile the Senate adopted a majority committee report favoring passage of the newly introduced bill.

Proponents of the measures in each house insisted supervision of school and road building by the board is necessary. Opponents objected the Legislature was attempting to give to the board autocratic and "kingly" powers.

Two of Alleged Unsuccessful Bandit Gang Are Taken Here.

Officers from Lebanon, Ind., left today with Carl Allen, 23, of 3215 Kenwood Ave., and Charles Warner, 19, of 836 N. Beville Ave., arrested here Wednesday on fugitive and vagrancy charges.

With another arrest imminent detectives declare they will have rounded up all of an alleged gang of bandits who attempted to hold-up and rob Charles Houser, Lebanon garage man, at 2 a. m. Feb. 24.

Two men captured at the garage registered as Herbert Gentleman, 21, of 114 W. Thirty-Second St., and Thomas Kofour, 17, of 2702 Ashland Ave. The latter was freed on \$1,000 bond to appear in a Lebanon court.

Detectives Bugenstein, Sullivan, Golder and McDonald found in a private garage at Twenty-Fourth St. and McPherson Ave., an automobile believed to have been the one used by three of the gang in escaping from Lebanon. A bullet hole was in the windshield. Twelve shots were fired by Lebanon police.
