BRITAIN CANNOT DROP CHARGES

Empire Will Not Accede to
U. S. Demands.

LONDON, March 8.—Great Britain cannot accede to the demand of the United States that charges against former American consul and vice consul at New Castle of influencing trade in favor of American ships be withdrawn, Under Secretary McNeil stated in the House of Commons last night.

McNeil, replying to Adams, a Labor member from New Castle who drew attention to the act of the United States in closing the consulate there, admitted the British charges were unsubstantiated, but said the government believed them justified.

Accusations against the American consular officers at New Castle on Tyne resulted in the American Government ordering the consulate closed.

ALL MOSLEMS ARE SUMMONED TO COLORS

Mohammedans Between 23 and 39
Ordered to Recruiting Stations.


