

BULGIN PREDICTS SECOND COMING OF CHRIST SOON

Wars and Influenza Epidemic Cited as Signs by Evangelist.

All prophecies in the New Testament point to the second coming of Christ soon, declared the Rev. Dr. E. J. Bulgin in a sermon Sunday night before 8,000 people at Cadle Tabernacle.

Some of the signs fulfilled are the presence of the anti-Christ wars and rumors of wars, and a mighty pestilence, the influenza, the evangelist declared.

Churches in Indianapolis are in a rut, which is an elongated grave, he said. Too much church and not enough Christianity is their weakness, Bulgin said.

"Just One at a Time"

"I did not come to Indianapolis to attack any church, however," Bulgin said. "I am here to help any one join any church he wants. I only ask a man to join one church at a time."

The text was from second Kings: "This place is too straight for us," and was used by the speaker to illustrate growth and life in churches.

Part of the religious stagnation prevalent, the speaker said, is due to absence of the Bible from homes and schools.

Dearth in Ministry

"The day is gone when the Bible was studied in the home," he said.

"The altars are down and there is a dearth in the ministry today because mothers urge their sons to be lawyers or Senators."

"People say they don't want to be Christians because they don't understand God. General Grant never stopped to explain each order to each soldier. When his orders were 'March,' the soldier didn't have to know what it was about and why."

Christianity is a simple everyday thing, the speaker said. "To be a Christian a woman does not have to be a public speaker. Neither does it require prayer, but it does require prayer."

"You had better get down on your knees and pray each morning before you go to work."

Dr. R. J. Aley Forecasts Tremendous Growth in Colleges.
