Mrs. Miller, formerly employed at the Green Parrot Tearooms in New York, gave evidence which W. E. D. Stokes will use in re-hearing of his divorce case May 14. She declared she saw the woman she then knew as "Helen" when she took meals to the apartment.

"Sometimes 'Helen' was dressed in silk underwear and sometimes she had her dress partly on, not fastened. I never saw her when she was really dressed up."

Mrs. Stokes, in her suite at the Blackstone Hotel, branded the story of the witness as "coached testimony."

Mrs. Miller gave her deposition before Julian C. Ryer, appointed commissioner by the New York court, and Daniel Nugent, lawyer for Stokes, and Isadore Shapero, counsel for Mrs. Stokes.
