tion of \$50,000. to the acceptance and satisfaction of the Governor of this State, is conditioned that if any contract be awarded to any bidder, such bidder will enter into a contract to perform the conditions of said bid and conform to the requirements of the textbook laws of Indiana to the acceptance and satisfaction of said board.

Said publishers shall specify the weight and quality of book cloth used; the weight and quality of thread used; the weight of the paper used; the quality of glue used in the binding; and the quality of the ink used in the printing.

No bid shall be considered unless the same be accompanied by the affidavit of bidder that he is in no wise directly or indirectly, connected with any other publisher or firm who is bidding for books submitted to such board, nor has any pecuniary interest in any other publisher or printing establishment at the same time, and that he is not a partner, officer, or director of any such publisher or printing establishment.
