oats on his estate.


I tapped him with my fan good-

Mrs. Minnie Franklin Alleges an At-  
tempt to Kidnap and Attack

As a climax of what Emanuel Gabauer, 21, of 2630 College Ave., today  
described as a "joy ride with two mar-  
ried women," he was under arrest  
charged with attempt to attack Mrs. Minnie Franklin, 2234 W. Morris St.,  
and with drawing deadly weapons.

Mrs. Ethel Thomas, 29, of 1205 W.  
Ray St., was charged with assault and  
battery with intent to kidnap. Both  
were arrested on warrants sworn to by  
Mrs. Franklin. Detectives Lash and  
Englebright made the arrests.

The "joy ride" occurred Wednesday.  
Gabauer said. He said a man named  
Davis threw a hammer through the  
glass of his car and also told of a  
flight with four men. He said he drew a  
revolver and forced the men to stand  
back. Gabauer denied any attack on  
Mrs. Franklin.


