Rust was being returned to Aberdeen, where he broke jail while being held for five robberies. He was recaptured at Grand Forks and was being transported by Fulkner without handcuffs.

As the train pulled into Wolverton, the prisoner seized a gun from Fulkner's belt, fired a shot into the sheriff's body and leaped through a window.

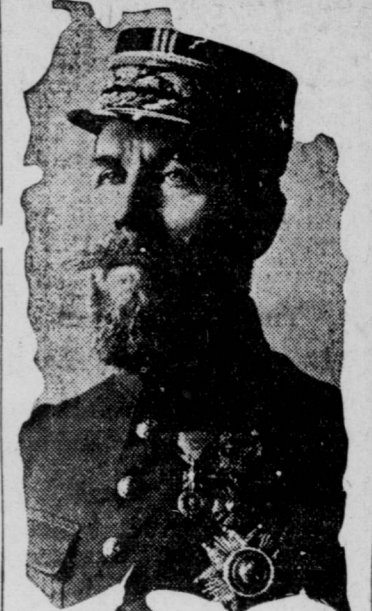

## COOPERATIVE PLAN OF STOCK SALE IS BEING TRIED HERE

Central Indiana Power Co. Obtains Cooperation of Employees—Customers.

In line with the latest policy of successful public utilities having their capital stock owned by employees and customers, the Central Indiana Power Company is conducting a similar campaign in this State.

The fact that the company's properties embrace 106 of the most prosperous cities and towns in central and northern Indiana, in the heart of Hoosierdom's industrial and agricultural area, is a splendid argument to the general public that the Central Indiana Power preferred stock is a first-class investment. The money is being placed in local business to promote growth and welfare.

The movement among large public utility corporations to have securities held largely by their own customers, known as the "customer's ownership" plan, is only a decade old. Two hundred electric light and power companies have endeavored to make actual partners of the people they serve.

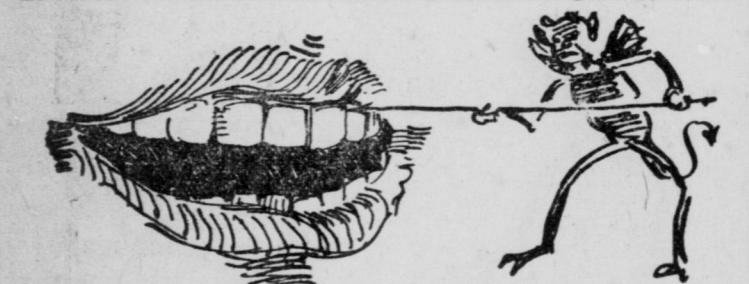
