BLOOMINGTON, Ind., July 5.—The
water situation which has been a
great handicap to the city may not
be alleviated in the near future if
the opposition of Mayor John G. Har-
ris and residents of the Spring Creek
valley is successful. A remonstrance
against issuance of bonds for a new
plant, signed by the mayor and resi-
dents of that section, will be present-
ed to the State tax board.

The mayor's plan was to enlarge
the old plant. The tax board, to-
gether with the city council, repudi-
ated the plan.



FIGHT IS SCORED**

Citizenship Conference Dele-
gates Register Disapproval.

WINONA LAKE, Ind., July 5.—The
Dempsey-Gibbons fight at Shelly,
Mont., was denounced by speakers at
the consultation conference on Chris-
tian citizenship Wednesday. Chris-
tians of the Nation should protest
against such desecration of a holiday,
they declared.

About ten thousand persons crowded
the Billy Sunday tabernacle to hear an address on "Loyalty to Coun-
try and to Country's God" by Wil-
liam Jennings Bryan. Bryan roundly
scored Governor Al Smith. New
York.

It is no test of a citizen's loyalty
to obey the laws he likes; law is not
needed to compel a person to do what
he wants to do, for he does that with-
out law," Bryan declared. "The wots
have recently come from under cover
and disclosed their real purpose, which
is to paralyze enforcement. They have
raised an issue never before known
in this country, namely law or law-
lessness."

Turning to the matter of education,
Bryan said, "Teachers in public
schools, drawing pay from taxation,
have undermined faith in God as well
as faith in the Bible and in Christ."


