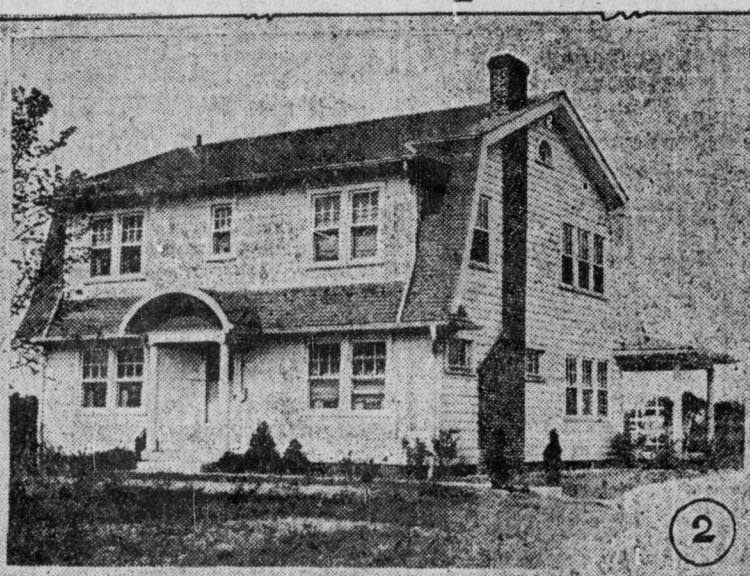

LUMBER DEMAND TAXES CAPACITY OF LOCAL YARDS

Skilled Cabinet Makers in Demand for Built-in Work.

Notwithstanding the ever-increasing number of houses that are being constructed of brick, cement and stone, the lumber yards of Indianapolis are running to capacity and still unable to get their orders out on time, according to W. J. Goodwin, manager of the Brookside Lumber Company.

"Since the perfection of the built-in feature and its universal usage there is a tremendous lot of work done in our built-in department," he said. "The work is so heavy that it has been necessary to have a department to care for this alone. Cabinet makers during the last decade had almost disappeared and today we find it very difficult to find men, who are completely trained in this sort of work, which really requires infinite care in detail finishing."

"There never has been anything devised up to the present time, that will take the place of wood in interior finish and certainly there never has been a time when the variety of finishes and the artistic possibilities of interior finishes have equalled those of today."

"One of the woods popular in this kind of work is gum. Until very recently this was not used at all because of the imperfection in the process of drying it; today it is scientifically dried, so that it is absolutely satisfactory and is capable of many very beautiful treatments."

"We are building another new shed in the attempt to keep pace with our steady growth; we can accommodate about a million and a half feet of lumber with this new addition. Our shipments are coming in rapidly; the people in the South are attempting to get all orders out in the shortest time possible, for their working season between rainy seasons really is very short."

"One of our late downtown jobs is the interior work on the new quarters for the National Cash Register Company, 120 S. Meridian St. The plans call for four fourteen-foot display rooms with a seventeen-foot display window. The work will be in birch, with mahogany finish."

NORTH SIDE HOME HAS 'WELCOME' AIR

Residence of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Bridges Combines Comfort and Convenience in Well-Arranged House.

Attractively situated, with a winding drive leading from the street past the south side of the house, the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Bridges, 4481 N. Illinois St., is interesting in design and seems to extend with the comfort of its furnishings, a certain charm and friendliness. The exterior of the house is pleasing, with a green shingle roof and a variegated brick chimney, furnishing a bit of color relief against the white walls.

One enters a center hall with the large, welcoming living room on the right and the dining room on the left. Immediately back of the living room is a library and music room, while the kitchen and breakfast room are just back of the dining room. From the hall a stairway leads to the second floor, which includes bedrooms of ample size, and a commodious bathroom.

Friendly Living Room

There is always a feeling of comfort where heavy upholstered furniture is used, especially if there is a fireplace. The tapestry of the upholstery in this room is of a cheerful floral pattern in harmonizing subdued shades. The linen cretonne valances over the pongee drapes add their delightful bit of color harmony, as do the lighting fixtures. The mahogany woodwork gives richness and dignity to the room. Book cases flank the fireplace.

Interesting in furnishings of wicker upholstered in tapestry, the library and music-room is comfortable and attractive. A desk adds to the charm and convenience of the room, and many pleasant hours are promised by a piano.

In the American house of today much attention is given to the arrangement of the porch. This porch, with its comfortable white furniture, is reached from the music room or from the exterior, and is located well to the rear of the house and to the south, to provide seclusion and comfort. Shrubbery is well grouped about it, and it is one of the most pleasing details of the whole plan.

An inclosed porch on the rear provides a place for art ice box.

The kitchen and breakfast-room are most attractively treated in French gray, and in keeping with the steady advancement in planning kitchens, this room is convenient with its built-in features. As one enters from the hall, a built-in china closet with a number of interesting pieces of china catches the eye.

The upstairs rooms are conveniently planned and attractively furnished. The window arrangement in all the rooms is especially good for light and air.

COLORED BRICKS BEAUTIFY HOMES

W. W. Wise Points Out Advantages of Product.

Durability, low upkeep, attractiveness, are qualities of brick that recommend it to the home builder of today.

Pleasing effects are now possible by the use of brick in varying colors, ranging from the lightest buff to deep red with occasional bronze greens. The choice of color is almost unlimited when one considers further difference that may be obtained by the use of different colored mortars.

According to W. W. Wise, brick contractor, much depends on the quality of the bricks that go into a house. It does not pay to use bricks of an inferior grade, for not only does the finished job present an unsatisfactory appearance, but there is so much waste connected with laying of poor bricks that the actual cash difference in the first cost of the bricks is much less than the figures would indicate.

More and more houses are being constructed of brick because in addition to their permanency, they afford a fireproof structure. This material improves with age rather than losing its freshness.

MAINTENANCE COSTS RISE

City Pays \$896,605.502 to Keep Up Parks and Boulevards.

Maintenance of the city's thirty-seven and one-half miles of boulevards and 1,452 acres of public parks cost \$896,605.502 in 1922, a statement today shows. The figure represents an increase of \$89,576.71 over last year.

Among the larger items in the total are the Douglass park swimming pool, which cost \$60,000, and the Fall creek retaining wall, \$48,000.

Receipts of the board were \$898,198.48. Pay rolls totaled \$175,771.24.
