Albert Waldbieser Home Combination of Beauty, Comfort and Stability



Constructed of buff brick, the home of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Waldbieser marks a high degree of perfection in the combination of stability, comfort and beauty. The house, located at 5027 Washington Blvd., stands well back from the street with a drive leading past the south side of the house to the garage on the rear.

The front entrance is rather formal with two stone steps leading up to the heavy, wide, hospitable looking door with side lights on either side; white columns rising from the ends of the door platform support a small balcony. The windows of the second story are shuttered with solid green shutters in a soft shade of green, which is repeated in the composition shingles of the roof. The windows of the first floor front are in triple arrangement with a decorative wood motif placed above them.

The dining room is furnished in massive mahogany of a colonial pattern; the blue and gold of the paper in this room lend color to the room. Bold white and black stripe paper with flaming macaws covers the walls of the breakfast room, which is altogether pleasing and convenient in its arrangement, a china closet with cupboards below compose the entire south wall of the room.

The woodwork of the kitchen is gray and the granite linoleum affords a harmonious color scheme, the same kind of linoleum covers the breakfast room. The kitchen is very compact and convenient with its well-placed closets and pantry space.

Bathroom a Model in Arrangement

Tiled nearly to the top, the fixtures of square type, the snowy whiteness of the bathroom is broken only by the gray border that appears in the tiled floor. The arrangement of the bath is so planned as to utilize all possible space, and although the bath is smaller than the ones often seen, there are few if any that afford more convenience. On the west side of the room, there are two windows which emit plenty of air and light. Between them and the adjoining walls there are built in cabinets which furnish ample space for all linens and medicine.

The parquet floors with their rose taupe velvet rugs furnish a delightful background for the furnishings of the downstairs rooms. An overstuffed davenport and armchair are used in the living room with small groupings of mahogany tables and chairs. The fireplace in the living room is a note of unusual beauty—the heavy ivory mantle with bronze-green tile seems equally attractive in winter and summer.

Cheerful indeed is the sun parlor with its ivory wicker furniture upholstered in cretonne, gay in pattern as the sun parlor.
