THREE ACQUITTED OF JURY FIXING

State Case Involving Gov. Small Collapses on Verdict.

By United Press WAUKESHA, Ill., July 18.—The "jury fixing" cases involving the acquittal of Governor Len Small of charges of conspiracy to embezzle State funds collapsed today.

John B. Fields, Small trial juror; Edward Kaufman and Edward Courtney were acquitted late yesterday in Circuit Court of conspiracy to corrupt the Small jury. The jury which found the trio not guilty took only one ballot on each defendant.

Attorneys said it was probable there were no further grand jury investigations of "fixing" charges.

REAPER AND STORK GAIN

Report Shows Increase in Births and Deaths in Indiana.

Deaths in Indiana during the first six months this year totaled 21,302, as compared with 18,972 for the corresponding months last year, a report of H. M. Wright, statistician for the State board of health shows.

The death rate for the period was 14.5 a thousand persons, as against 12.9 a thousand last year. Total births up to July 1 are shown to be 30,453, increase of 885 over last year. Pneumonia caused the largest number of deaths, 2,452.

FRENCH OFFICIALS FEAR SCRAPPING VERSAILLES PACT

Apprehension Displayed in Paris Over British Note to Germany.

By United Press PARIS, July 18.—French official circles are displaying apprehension over the forthcoming British note to Germany. Only the most reserved comments are forthcoming.

A considerable portion of the press sees in the British move to reach agreement on reparations through other means than force in the Ruhr, a scrapping of the Versailles treaty, and an end to the entente.

The Journal Industriel, which speaks for the industrialists and financiers of France, charges Great Britain with seeking to create two interpretations of the Versailles treaty—one a British version bringing in the other allies; another isolating France and depriving her of support of the allies against Germany.

"Britain would nullify the treaty as regards France, but continue herself

Frank White, 7, Tells Parents of Many Delights of Merry-Go-Round.

The merry-go-round at Broad Ripple Park was attractive to Frank White, 7, son of Mr. and Mrs. James White, 4028 Sutherland Ave.

But he admits today that two days of association with that amusement device was sufficient, and that, after all, there is no place like home.

Frank had memories of the merry-go-round last Sunday while playing with other children near his home. At about 1 p. m. Sunday he wandered away.

When he did not show up that evening his parents notified police and a city-wide search was started. Frank had run away before, but his absence had always been short. Fall Creek runs near the White home and the parents were almost frantic.

The search continued Monday without a trace being found. It was resumed Tuesday.

Tuesday afternoon a small, tired,

dirty-faced boy walked into the White home and remarked:

"Hello, mamma, I'm home."

Then Frank explained about the merry-go-round. He said he had slept in the park. But his story was vague except for the single fact that the merry-go-round was just about the greatest thing in the world.

H. A. Engle, 313 N. Elder Ave., today reported his son, Omar, 15, missing since Saturday. Omar is five feet eight inches tall and weighs 135 pounds. He wore a dark cap, dark blue shirt, and dark trousers.

The police were searching for him for Espel Klimmaman, 12, of 1130½ S. Meridian St. The boy left home to visit his father, who lives in the 400 block in Madison Ave. He did not arrive there.

TAILOR IS SOUGHT AS SLAYER OF CONTRACTOR

FATHER KILLS MAN WHO BROKE DATE

Fatal Shooting Occurs After Quarrel of Young People.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., July 18.—Horace R. Logsdon, 23, is dead from bullet wounds and M. F. Strickland, 59, is lodged in the Gallatin County jail today, because, police say, Logsdon broke a date with Strickland's daughter, Geneva Strickland. The shooting occurred Monday.

According to evidence given authorities, the son reported to his father that she had quarreled with Logsdon because he had failed to keep an appointment with her. The father, said to have been under the influence of bootleg liquor, went to the home of

Logsdon. He fired two shots, which took effect in Logsdon's abdomen. The young man's mother, Mrs. Joseph Logsdon, is said to have thrown herself between Strickland and her son, but he fell unconscious at her feet.
