

## HUGHES PUTS BAN ON RECOGNITION OF SOVIET RUSSIA

Statement of Secretary of State Answers Question of Samuel Gompers.

WASHINGTON, July 23.—In a new statement on the Russian question Secretary of State Hughes lays down the policy of refusing to recognize the soviets as long as their leaders strive for world revolution.

In a letter to Samuel Gompers, who asked for an authoritative statement of the government's reasons for non-recognition, Hughes asserted the Russian government is based upon autocracy and the liberties of the people are not protected, even in the new constitution just adopted. But the real obstacles in the way of recognition is the soviet propaganda against foreign governments and the failure to protect the rights and property of foreigners within soviet jurisdiction.

Russia's obligations to the United States remain repudiated, American property in Russia has been confiscated without prospect of indemnification, and there is no indication the policy of confiscation is at an end, Hughes said.

"What is most serious," he continued, "is there is conclusive evidence those in control at Moscow have not given up their original purpose of destroying existing Governments wherever they can do so throughout the world. Their efforts in this direction have recently been lessened in intensity only by the reduction of the cash resources at their disposal.

## M'ADOO PICKED AS LEADING CANDIDATE

Sen. Royal S. Copeland Says Ford Could Be Elected if  
Nominated by One of Old Parties.

William Gibbs McAdoo is the leading candidate for the Democratic nomination for the presidency and will go into the convention next year with at least 50 per cent of the votes, in the opinion of Royal S. Copeland, Democratic United States senator from New York.

Senator Copeland stopped off in Indianapolis a short time on his way to Michigan for a vacation. He attended the meeting of the Pennsylvania Railroad Veterans' Association Saturday.

Senator Copeland, who himself has been mentioned for the presidency and

who is looked upon as one of the coming party leaders, has a number of other decided ideas about political conditions.

### Ford's Strength

Among them are these: Henry Ford could be elected if nominated by either of the old parties. If he seeks the election as a third candidate he will draw the radical vote of the La Follette-Brookhart type and will strengthen Democratic chances.

The biggest issue of the campaign will be a combination of foreign relations and the plight of the farmers—the restoration of a European demand

for American farm products being necessary to prosperity in this country. The tariff, immigration and labor also will be issues.

President Harding was right when he said the League of Nations is as dead as slavery, but the United States must participate in European affairs with a view to creating sound economical conditions.

### Smith's Action Consistent

The sentiment of the United States is dry, but Governor Al Smith of New York could no more consistently have vetoed the prohibition repealer than William Jennings Bryan could have signed it.

La Follette and other radical Republicans probably will not be able to control the next Republican convention and there is little possibility of their bolting.

Democratic success is assured unless the Democrats make some big mistake before the election.

"We have a mighty popular candidate for President in Governor Smith," Senator Copeland remarked in opening his discussion of the political situation.

It was suggested that Smith is not so popular in Indiana, where dry sentiment prevails to a certain extent.

### Economic Conference

"The whole country is dry," the Senator replied.

Senator Copeland sees little possibility of the nomination of either Smith or Senator Ralston of Indiana. He feels Underwood again will be a contender, but does not believe a compromise candidate will be necessary.

"No tariff ever will solve the foreign trade problem," Copeland said. "There must be an economic conference. The rate of exchange must be brought back to normal and the European workman must be paid a decent wage."

"As conditions exist in Europe there can be no demand for American products and until such demand is created, prices must remain low."
