

ORDER TO ARREST LOAFERS FAILS TO STOP BURGLARIES

Thieves Grow Bold—Carry
Away Iron Bed and Porch
Swing.

Despite special orders issued two days ago by Police Chief Herman Rikhoff to arrest all "loafers" burglary reports continued to come in today.
