

ONE DISCHARGED IN CASE ALLEGING INCITING OF RIOT

Motion to Dismiss Watt Wise
Taken Under Advisement
Until Sept. 5.

The case of Carl Ferree, 22 N. Bloomington St., was discharged in city court Wednesday on a motion by R. E. Updike, attorney for the defendants, by Judge Delbert O. Wilcox, and a motion to discharge Watt Wise, 230 N. Miley Ave., was taken under advisement until Sept. 5.

Both men were charged with inciting a riot following an attack upon city firemen and policemen when they were called to Miley Ave. and Vermont St. to extinguish a burning cross the night of July 18.

Serg. Donald Tooley testified he was hit on the head with a bucket while attempting to go through a crowd of 3,000 from which he said threats were heard.

Joe Dillon, 560 Goodlet St.; Edward McGinnis, 1305 Walnut St.; Charles Treadway, 33 N. Tremont St.; and Thomas Graham, 723 Pershing Ave., all members of the Indianapolis fire department, who were called to extinguish the cross, testified they were hit by stones, and as they passed

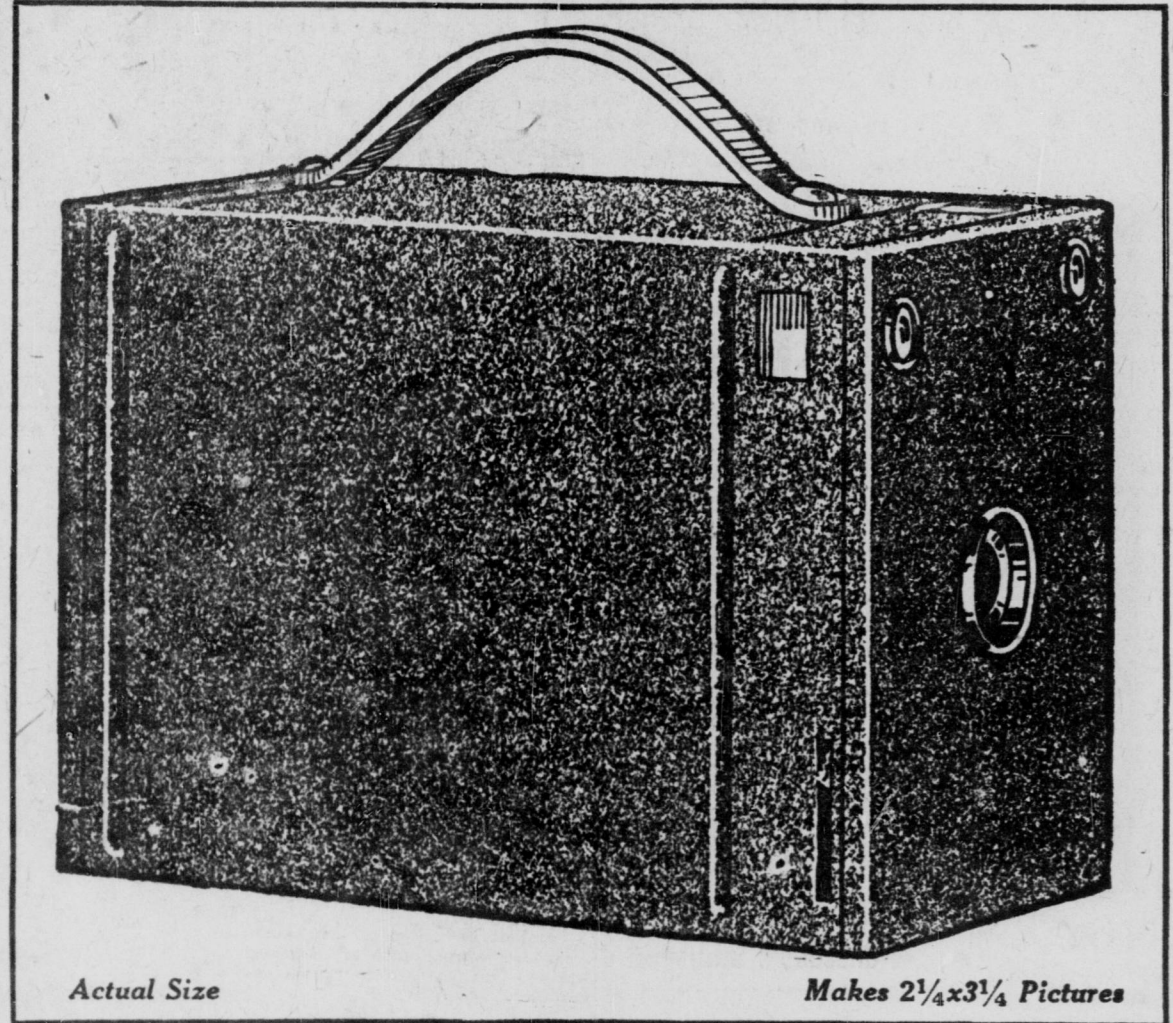
