

TARIFF TAX \$1.55 ON FARMERS' BILL THIS YEAR, CLAIM

Why Farmers Threaten New
Political Revolt Is
Explained.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—The Kansas farmer gets \$1.55 this year in increased prices because of the tariff. Then the same tariff turns right around and takes from the Kansas farmer \$282.40 in increased prices for the things he must buy.

If that is not gold-bricking the farmer, then the days of gold-bricks are gone forever. And if that does not tell why the Kansas farmer is threatening political revolution and denouncing Wall Street then you will never understand, according to figures compiled by the Fair Tariff League. They are based on the best possible consideration for the Kansas farmer. He produces 200,000 bushels of spring wheat and the tariff promised him \$20,000 on it.

Tariff Boosts Prices

Of course he did not collect. He produced 1,878,159 pounds of wool and the tariff gave him \$175,026 on that. He produced 7,942 tons of sugar beets and the tariff gave him \$41,787 on that. He produced 72,948 tons of flaxseed and the tariff gave him \$19,885 on that. The total promised him was \$256,698.

But the farmer of Kansas has to buy something. He buys flour, wool, sugar, flaxseed, and lemons, for example.

The tariff on these at lowest figures cost him as follows: Flour, \$2.64; wool, \$715,688; sugar, \$1,504,102; flaxseed, \$70,825; lemons, \$82,648. The total tariff cost on farm products was \$2,455,901.

41 Million, the Cost

Then the farmer of Kansas pays \$6,198,225 in tariff on heavy steel products, \$8,264,300 on light steel products and \$24,793,000 on general store merchandise. That is not all, but practically all the cost that can be discovered.

The Kansas farmer pays \$41,711,426 for the \$256,698 the tariff gives him.

Taking the Kansas farmer and the city consumers of Kansas and they all pay \$86,838,269 for the \$256,698 given Kansas by the tariff.

And the story in every farming State is the same.

Adirondack Boys Kill Them for Bounty.






