STATE HEALTH FIGURES

Insurance Report Shows Indiana and
Michigan About Even.

Indiana and Michigan ran a close
race in the mortality of their city
dwelling wage-earners, according to
the report of the Metropolitan Life
Insurance Company for 1923. Based
upon the mortality of white,
industrial policy-holders, the death
rate in each was 8 per 1,000. The col-
ored death rate in Indiana of 12.3 per
1,000 was 4.4 lower than that of Mich-
igan.

WHEAT POOL INCREASES

Indiana Farmers Sign Crops to Co-
operative Market.

Indianapolis officials of the Indiana
Federation of Farm Bureaus report
that between 100,000 and 200,000 bush-
els of wheat are being signed daily
to the Indiana wheat pool.

Under the plan, farmers make the
association sole agent for the mar-
keting of the wheat for five years.
Considerable increase in the farmer's
net return, without affecting the price
of flour or bread, is expected to re-
sult.

The movement is being supported
by some of the largest wheat growers
of the State.

DAWES REPORT HAS CHANCE OF FINAL SUCCESS

Germany Objects Because
Definite Reparations Total
Is Not Named.

WASHINGTON, April 10. — With
strong objections certain to be made
to it, the Dawes report stands better
than an even chance to effect a final
settlement of the reparations problem,
officials and diplomatic Washington
believed today.

The principal objection expected is

the report does not recommend a defi-
nite total reparations figure, a fact
to which Germany is already object-
ing. Reparations the reich now is
under obligation to pay total 132,000,
000,000 gold marks.

The reason the expert's report did
not deal with a total sum is General
Dawes found at the start that to try
to fix a total would wreck the in-
quiry.

The total indemnity Germany
must meet, even if the Dawes plan
is accepted, may be worked out in
a European economic conference
called to put the exports' report into
effect, or might result from a satis-
factory execution by Germany of her
obligations under the plan over a
period of years.

France probably will approve the
plan.

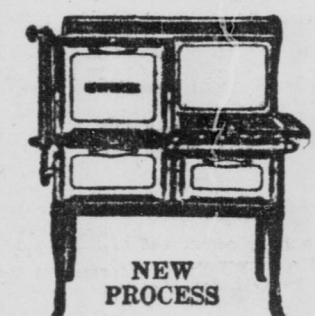

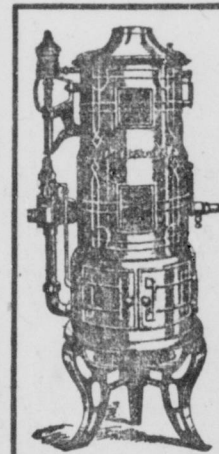

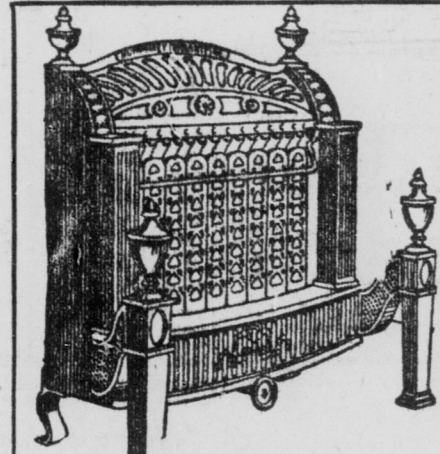
