Valedictory ceremonies will be held at 3 p.m. on Graham Chapel lawn.



The investigation of the mysterious shooting of Dr. Joseph C. McGrail, dentist, 5438 N. New Jersey St., fatally wounded while passing Washington Blvd. and Fifty-Fourth St., Wednesday night, May 14, will go forward in two channels, detectives said today.

Finding of the gun which de-

tectives say was the one used in the

shooting, in a sewer catch basin, Wednesday, opened new clews.

McGrail told Sergt. Ralph Dean he was en route home when two young men in an auto held him up, took \$38 and fired one shot. He staggered to his home with a bullet wound in the abdomen and collapsed at the doorstep.

His pocketbook was found next

day by a lineman at Delaware and Fifty-Fourth St., a block west of the place of the shooting.

Detectives also said Dr. McGrail

who had been ill for more than a

year and just recently returned to

his practice, and was despondent

over poor business conditions. He

had planned on selling his business

and property, they say.

Louis Roudebush, proprietor of a

cleaning establishment at 2234 E. Washington St., and a friend of the

shooting, he delivered a suit to his

office, and at that time McGrail

asked him if he knew where he

could get a .32-calibre revolver, the

same calibre as the one with which

he was shot.

The number of the revolver found

Wednesday was sent to the Iver-

Johnson Revolver Company in an

effort to trace the ownership.

**CADLE OPPOSES
DANCE AND JAZZ
AT TABERNACLE**

Promises Suit If Building Is
'Misused' in Breach of
Contract.

Branding the proposed fancy dancing and jazz music at Cadle Tabernacle as "a desecration," E. Howard Cadle, founder and former owner of the Cadle Tabernacle, today served written notice upon the present owners of the tabernacle he would "take such steps as are necessary to preserve the property for the uses for which it was erected."

Cadle, in a letter to Daniel L. Speicher, Walter S. Hunsing and J. W. Speicher, objected formally to the proposed "Speedfest Jubilee" to be given at the tabernacle by Sam Grotto.

In the letter Cadle declares sale of the tabernacle to the new owners was upon the following conditions:

"The building shall always carry the name of Cadle Tabernacle and that the property shall always be used for religious, civic and municipal purposes for the moral, social and spiritual upbuilding of humanity and the advancing of God's Kingdom."

Cadle has previously stated he

will file suit in the Superior Court

asking for an injunction to prevent any "misuse" of the building.

Those at the Tabernacle refused to make any statement in the absence of Daniel L. Speicher and other owners.




