GARY, Ind., Oct. 10.—With one of the most active La Follette-for-President Clubs in the State organized and well under way in the short space of five weeks, Republican and Democratic leaders in Lake County have ample cause to fear the inroad "Fighting Bob" will make in their ranks. When strong Republican leaders are freely predicting La Follette will lead Davis in the county and Democrats are venturing the same guess regarding President Coolidge's chances against the independent, it is time to reckon.

M'CULLOCH SCANS FARM CONDITIONS

Pleas for Advancement of Agriculture.

MT. VERNON, Ind., Oct. 10.—"Until agriculture is lifted to the same economic level as capital and labor, it will continue to be the 'Cinderella' of vocations," said Dr. McCulloch here Thursday night.

"Capital has combined for its betterment and profit. Labor has combined for its advancement in wages and working conditions. Agriculture has been left behind."

He advocated passage of a farmers cooperative marketing law and reappraisal of real estate as things to bring relief to the farmer. He further advocated decentralization of the State administration and giving back to counties and towns control of their own affairs. He ridiculed the claim of Jackson that tax rates had been reduced simply because the tax is lower than it was at one time during the Ralston administration. He said property valuations had been so enormously increased that the net result was that taxes are higher than they have ever been.

BRITISH CAMPAIGN ON MacDonald and Labor Cabinet Draft Party Manifesto.

LONDON, Oct. 10.—Facing the shortest election campaign on record, party headquarters today were scenes of whirlwind activity.

Prime Minister MacDonald and his Labor cabinet, whose defeat in Commons over a minor domestic affair may bring to a close England's first Labor regime, after only nine months in office, continued drafting the party manifesto for the election, Oct. 29.

MacDonald announced he would start from Glasgow Monday on a four-day automobile trip in which he would tour the industrial districts.

DANIELS FILES

BANKRUPT SUIT

Cordage Company President Lists Liabilities.

Petition asking La Monte Daniels, president Indianapolis Cordage Company, 1959 S. Meridian St., be adjudged a bankrupt is on file in Federal Court as result of action taken by Daniels, Thursday. Daniels' liabilities were listed at \$306,504.80 and assets, \$676.17.

Yucatan Company, from which the Cordage Company purchased supplies, holds notes totaling \$229,904.30, the petition stated. Company's property was recently ordered sold by the Marion County Superior Court to satisfy a mortgage of \$268,550, according to the petition.

Among assets listed were an equity of \$12,000 in a residence at 4410 N. Meridian St., insurance and personal property. Daniels had pledged \$1,600 to social welfare projects.
