

## EFFORT TO PLACE RAYMOND UPON TICKET SCORED

La Follette Chairman Sees  
'Chicanery'—Move Is  
Ended.

A. F. Bentley, La Follette Progressive party State chairman, today declared the move to place the name of Rudolph D. Raymond, Valparaiso, on the La Follette ballot as a candidate for Governor a piece of "political chicanery."

It was pointed out that Daniel L. Bock, attorney, who filed the supplementary petition with the board of election commissioners urging Raymond's name be placed on the La Follette ticket, is a member of D. C. Stephenson's legal staff, with offices in the Central States Coal Company, 304 Kresge building, Stephenson is former grand dragon of the Ku-Klux Klan in Indiana.

Bock said today, following action of Judge James M. Leathers in sustaining an injunction forcing Raymond's name off the ballot, he would carry the case no further. He had previously stated he would bring mandamus proceedings to force the board to keep Raymond on the ticket.

### Filed as Independent

Raymond first filed as an independent candidate for Governor. Bentley declared the La Follette party a thorough organization with a party emblem and as such had the authority to direct who should and who should not be candidates under that party emblem.

Political leaders see in the move to place Raymond on the La Follette ticket attempt to deflect La Follette votes from Dr. Carlton B. McCulloch, the Democratic candidate, in order to aid Ed Jackson, Republican, backed by Stephenson, on the theory La Follette supporters with a candidate of their own for Governor, would likely support him instead of McCulloch.

### Six Parties Left

State election board was enjoined from placing six parties on the ticket Thursday by Superior Judge James M. Leathers on complaint of representatives of the Republican and Democratic parties. Irregularities in petitions were alleged. Parties now remaining on the ticket: Republican, Democratic, La Follette, Progressive, Prohibition, Socialist and Workers.

Copy was to be placed in the hands of the printer today for printing of the ballots.

County clerks will receive absent voters' ballots Saturday and Monday at the Statehouse, where the north lobby has been equipped with tables and seating apparatus. Thirty-five persons will be employed to wrap and seal ballots.

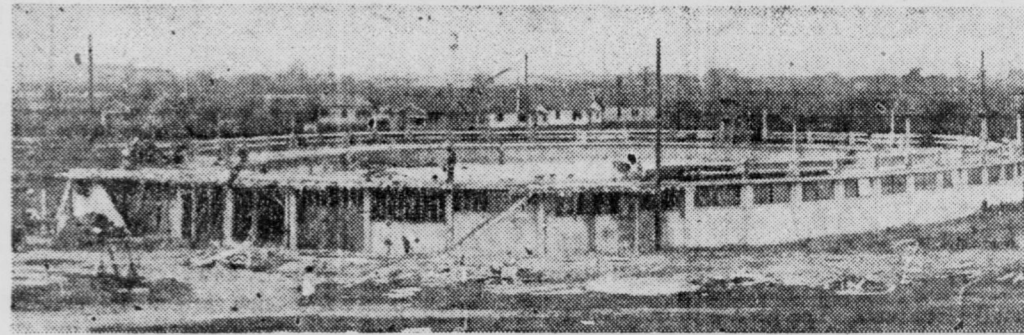

## New Swimming Pool at Park Near Completion



PUBLIC SWIMMING POOL AT RHODIUS PARK

The \$85,000 public swimming pool in the southeast corner of Rhodius Park will be completed about Nov. 15, according to E. F. Smith, 2060 S. Harding St., contractor.

The oval pool, which will be modern in every respect, is 21,000 square feet in area. It is 200 feet

long and 135 feet wide. An eighteen-foot concourse floor surrounds the pool, which is three feet deep at the shallow end and nine feet at the other. Under the floor are 1,700 lockers and showers for men and women.

All water goes through a chlorine filtering system, with a capacity of 25,000 gallons an hour.

Entrance is on the south end, with steps at each side. A concrete railing and benches will be erected around the pool, with electric fountain, and two arc lights over the center.

Capacity is 631,000 gallons. Springboards of various heights will be placed at the south end.

## SHERWOOD TALKS TO COUNTY HEADS

Candidate Gives Highlights  
of Platform.

Choice of school officials and teachers should be divorced from partisan politics, Oscar M. Sherwood, Republican candidate for State superintendent of public instruction, declared Tuesday in a talk before county superintendents at the Claypool. He also declared himself in favor of co-operation of State and local school officials and of the teachers' license law.

He declared that, if elected, he would make every effort to obtain rigid enforcement of the law prohibiting sale of tobacco to school children.

Sherwood has been the center of a controversy growing out of his connection with a teachers' magazine which, it is charged, failed to deliver copies after subscriptions had been sent in.

### FEW ROOMS REQUESTED

Less Than 500 Home Accommodations Are Asked by Teachers.

Demand for rooms in private homes by teachers attending the State Teachers' Association convention is lightest in seven years according to the Chamber of Commerce housing department. Less than 500 rooms in private homes were assigned Thursday, usually the day on which a tremendous demand is registered.

Lack of demand for rooms is not due to light attendance, as the registration increases with each year, or to any unwillingness on part of teachers to take advantage of the service, but solely to the fact that many teachers who have attended in the past have housed themselves during other conventions, Earl L. Ferguson, bureau manager, declared.
