

EFFORT TO PLACE RAYMOND UPON TICKET SCORED

La Follette Chairman Sees
'Chicanery'—Move Is
Ended.

A. F. Bentley, La Follette Progressive party state chairman, today declared the move to place the name of Rudolph D. Raymond, Valparaiso, on the La Follette ballot as a candidate for Governor a piece of "political chicanery."

It was pointed out that Daniel L. Bock, attorney, who filed the supplementary petition with the board of election commissioners urging Raymond's name be placed on the La Follette ticket, is a member of D. C. Stephenson's legal staff, with offices in the Central States Coal Company, 304 Kresge building. Stephenson is former grand dragon of the Ku-Klux Klan in Indiana.

Bock said today, following action of Judge James M. Leathers in sustaining an injunction forcing Raymond's name off the ballot, he would carry the case no further. He had previously stated he would bring mandamus proceedings to force the board to keep Raymond on the ticket.

Filed as Independent

Raymond first filed as an independent candidate for Governor. Bentley declared the La Follette party a thorough organization with a party emblem and as such had the authority to direct who should and who should not be candidates under that party emblem.

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Six Parties Left

State election board was enjoined from placing six parties on the ticket Thursday by Superior Judge James M. Leathers on complaint of representatives of the Republicans and Democratic parties. Irregularities in petitions were alleged. Parties now remaining on the ticket: Republican, Democratic, La Follette-Progressive, Prohibition, Socialist and Workers.

Copies were to be placed in the hands of the printer today for printing of the ballots.

County clerks will receive absent voters' ballots Saturday and Monday at the Statehouse, where the north lobby has been equipped with tables and sealing apparatus. Thirty-five persons will be employed to wrap and seal ballots.



New Swimming Pool at Park Near Completion



PUBLIC SWIMMING POOL AT RHODIUS PARK

The \$85,000 public swimming pool in the southeast corner of Rhodius Park will be completed about Nov. 15, according to E. F. Smith, 2050 S. Harding St., contractor.

The oval pool, which will be modern in every respect, is 21,000 square feet in area. It is 200 feet

long and 135 feet wide. An eighteen-foot concourse floor surrounds the pool, which is three feet deep at the shallow end and nine feet at the other. Under the floor are 1,700 lockers and showers for men and women.

All water goes through a chlorine filtering system, with a ca-

pacity of 25,000 gallons an hour. Entrance is on the south end, with steps at each side. A concrete railing and benches will be erected around the pool, with electric fountain, and two arc lights over the center.

Capacity is 631,000 gallons. Springboards of various heights will be placed at the south end.

Relief Campaign Will Close on For-
get-Me-Not Day.

The relief fund drive which began Oct. 8 for Disabled American Veterans of the World War will close Nov. 8 with the annual sale of forget-me-nots. H. Earl Brown, chairman of the drive committee, announced today.

The organization, pays no salaries to its administrative officers, and its income, aside from \$3 dues from each member, is derived almost solely from the sale of the flowers. The Disabled Veterans provides temporary relief for unfortunate soldiers and legal advice for those presenting claims to the Government.
