

FEEDER BUSES ARE CONSIDERED BY COMMISSION

Service for Sections Without Street Cars Proposed.

Proposals of the Indianapolis Street Railway Company to operate feeder bus lines serving sections without street car facilities are under consideration of city officials today in a joint meeting of a citizens transportation committee and city plan commission.

Robert I. Todd, president of the company, submitted plans to the park board Thursday for operating busses connecting with the end of the Mapleton line at Thirty-Ninth and Illinois Sts., north to Fortieth St., west to Capitol Ave., and north to Fifty-Second St. returning over the same route, and another line connecting with Central Ave. cars at Thirty-Fourth St., and running north on Central Ave. to Fifty-Second St.

Regular street car fare will be charged on the busses, with privilege of free transfer to street cars. Todd said four busses would be put in operation immediately, if the city approved plans. Charles A. Bookwalter, president of the park board, suggested the busses be operated down Capitol Ave. to Thirty-Fourth St., where connections could be made with all three branches of Indianapolis street car lines. Todd said the company would do this, if citizens desired.

The park board held a public hearing on operating busses on Capitol Ave. three weeks ago, at which time the Peoples Motor Coach Company, through A. Smith Bowman, president, sought permission to run on this boulevard. Todd said he believed residents south of Thirty-Fourth St. on Capitol Ave. did not want busses, suggesting "feeder lines" as the best solution.

CHURCH HAS NEW ORGAN

Tuxedo Park Baptist Church to Dedicate Instrument Tonight.

The pipe organ in the new Tuxedo Park Baptist Church, 29 Garfield Ave., will be dedicated tonight at 7:45 as part of the dedicatory services this week.

The Rev. U. S. Clutton, pastor of the church, will lead services. H. Leroy Baumgartner, assistant professor of the theory of music, Yale University, who designed and assisted in installing the organ, will give a recital. New organ is a two-manual instrument containing 700 pipes.

CASE IS POSTPONED

Petition for Removal of Lake County Prosecutor Continued to Nov. 5.

State Supreme Court has postponed until Nov. 5 a hearing on petition of Attorney General U. S. Lesh asking that Dwight Kinder, Lake County prosecutor, be removed from office because of his conviction as a member of the Lake County "boozie ring." Circuit Court of Appeals recently upheld Federal Court in the case in which R. O. Johnson, mayor of Gary, also was convicted.

An ouster petition was filed at the time of the first conviction, but the Supreme Court declined to act while the case was on appeal. If a rehearing of the case is granted, the court may withhold action again.

North Indianapolis Rejoices Over Its Success.






