

# BELATED WINTER CAUSES DROP IN HUNTING PERMITS

Slightly Over 400 Licenses  
Issued So Far This  
Month.

Warm weather has undoubtedly saved the life of many a nimble bunny, as Marion County hunters to date have taken out far less hunting licenses than in a corresponding period of 1923, according to the Gus Habich Company, 136 E. Washington St., one of the stores which issues the permits as agent of the State Department of Conservation.

A few more than 400 hunting licenses have been issued this month. The usual number of November is nearly 3,000. The day before Thanksgiving last year, 500 local Nimrods bought a license.

According to Misses Frances Morgan and Vida Scott, who are kept busy handling the department, the colder weather and opening of the quail season Monday, portends a rush of business, coupled with the fact that the annual Thanksgiving slaughter is about due.

October this year, however, saw only 630 licenses issued as compared to 882 in 1923. The company an-


