OUTLINE PROGRAMState Committee Holds
Formal Meeting.

The safety advisory committee recently appointed by Governor Emmett F. Branch and the public service commission to cooperate with Commissioner Frank T. Singleton in promotion of safety on Indiana highways and railroads held its first formal meeting today with Singleton.

Means of promoting safety were discussed and the complete functions of the unofficial body outlined. No legislative program is to be undertaken but the committee will provide such aid and information as desired by legislators seeking safety legislation.

MANNFELD HOLDS 'HOPE'

Fish and Game Head Against Diverting License Money.

A "hope" that no attempt will be made in the Indiana Legislature this year to reintroduce a proposition to divert hunting and fishing license money to the general fund and appropriate \$100,000 for the fish and game division, is expressed in monthly bulletin of George N. Mannfeld, State superintendent of fisheries and game.

This item was stricken from the appropriation bill in the last Legislature. Work of the division would have been curtailed seriously had the appropriation been made, as receipts for the fiscal year ended Sept. 30, 1924, totaled \$190,976.71, Mannfeld said.

A bill providing for a department for criminal insane in the Indiana Woman's prison will be introduced in the Legislature, according to Senator Russell B. Harrison, Marion County.
