'KID' M'COY GIVEN 1 TO 10-YEAR TERM

Ex-Pugilist's Attorneys May
Appeal Case.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Jan. 6.—Found guilty of manslaughter in connection with death of Mrs. Theresa Mors, "Kid" McCoy, ex-pugilist, was sentenced Thursday to serve from one to ten years in San Quentin penitentiary.

Judge Charles S. Crall denied the plea of McCoy's counsel for a new trial, but, after passing sentence, permitted the defense to carry the case to the Appellate Court.

McCoy stood up on his feet and took the sentence calmly, but there were tears in his eyes as he smiled at the judge and sat down.
