

MARCH SELECTED FOR HIGH SCHOOL STATE ASSEMBLY

'Legislators' to Be Chosen in County Conventions Feb. 14.

Detailed plans of the State-wide election for the Junior Legislature, composed of high school pupils, to assemble here March 23-25, were announced today by Dr. H. N. Sherwood, State superintendent of public instruction.

A board of election commissioners in each county, composed of the county superintendent, one principal and one civic or history teacher, the latter two to be named by the superintendent, is to have complete control of the election machinery.

Each commissioned high school elects delegates Jan. 30 to a district convention, usually a county to a district, which in turn elects senators

'BLUE SKY' TO BE TOPIC

These conventions will be held Feb. 14. Certification of election will be certified by the county superintendent to the State superintendent by Feb. 21. The Legislature convenes at the Statehouse, March 23, at 10 a. m., and adjourns at 1 p. m., March 25.

Requirements: Legislators must attend a regularly commissioned high school, must have passing grades for the previous and current semesters in at least three subjects, and must have a school citizenship certificate by the principal; where a county has more than one Representative, one must come from a township high school.

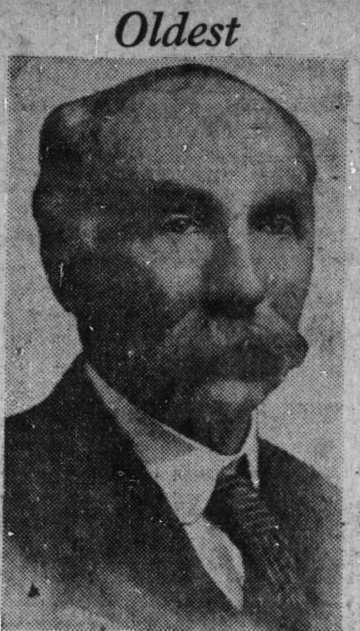
Each county in the State is to be represented either in the Senate or the House. While the exact number of Legislators of the regular General Assembly is not being followed, representation will be proportionate.

Marion County is to have five Senators and eleven Representatives. There will be no joint representation, each county having its sole Legislators.

The Democratic side of the State Senate boasts the oldest and youngest member of that body.

Senator Robert B. Shirley, of Woodburn, is the oldest at 75, and Senator C. Pralle Erni, New Albany, is the youngest at 29. Erni was elected in 1923.

Shirley was a member of the House in 1899 and in 1909 and was elected to the Senate in 1923.

He is opposed to the Goodrich tax law and any law permitting strikes, he said, and he is opposed to the proposed county unit school law.

"As I see it now I am opposed to pinning the Child Labor Amendment to the constitution of the United States," he said. He is also against any increase in the gasoline tax.
