

# ASKS FAVOR FROM COOLIDGE

Wants Greek Woman to Be Allowed to Remain.

AUSTIN, Texas, Jan. 23.—Governor "Ma" Ferguson of Texas has asked President Coolidge to do her a favor.

In a note sent the President, "Ma" asked him "as a favor to the Governor of Texas" to permit Mrs. Anastasios Kostas, aged Greek immigrant, to remain with her children in Houston, Texas. Mrs. Kostas was barred from residence in this country because of the immigration quota regulations.

"Ma" wants the President to let Mrs. Kostas stay and be entered in the next quota. This request is in line with the new Governor's policy of sentiment in government affairs which has riled legislators.

"Ma" announced she intended to put something of a woman's mercy in dealing with Texas convicts. During her first two days in office she granted four paroles.

### NEW ENUMERATION PLAN

Evansville Superintendent Proposes

#### Listing of Pupils.

J. O. Chewning, Evansville superintendent of schools, today presented to the State board of education in its monthly meeting a plan for a new school enumeration law which would base the count on number of pupils attending school and not on the number of children of school age in a municipality regardless of whether or not they go to school, as at present.

Chewning asserted the new plan would enable Evansville to retain its representation on the State board. If the board adopts the plan, it will be presented to Legislature.

Chewning said the new plan would save the State \$40,000 a year.

### FIRES BARN; KILLS SELF

Former Asylum Inmate Destroys Own Property; Ends Life.

GALESBURG, Ill., Jan. 23.—Earl Benson, 50, former inmate of the State asylum at Watertown, Thursday night set fire to a large barn on the farm occupied by Glenn McGirr, at Maquon, Ill., and then killed himself.

The barn burned with a loss of \$10,000. The farm was owned by Benson but was leased to McGirr.




