Farmers' Loss Feared

Arguments Put Forward Against Present Market Bill.

Passage of the cooperative marketing bill as it now stands would result in restriction of old contracts that would effect considerable hardship on certain classes of farmers, persons seeking amendments to the bill argued today.

Southern Indiana tobacco growers, freed by courts of contracts made with Kentucky burley associations, would be forced back to their original status and would be required to share deficits suffered by the associations during the slump in the tobacco market four years ago, it was said. The same situation would arise in Lake County also, it was said, in reference to a now defunct milk producers' association. Amendments seeking to clear this difficulty were killed when the bill passed second reading Wednesday.
