

CHEMICAL MEN FEAR DAWES PLAN

German Industry Enabled to
Get Large Loans.

NEW YORK, Jan. 30.—Use of American money by Germany menaces the chemical industry of the United States, it is declared by "Industrial Engineering Chemistry," official journal of the American Chemical Society.

"The chemical industry," it is asserted, "is deeply interested in the Dawes plan, because the confidence which its operation has restored has enabled the German chemical industry to secure large private loans in America."

"A determination to make the synthetic organic chemical industry independent, coupled with fortunate circumstances, has placed our industry in a position to compete in quality and variety of products and to provide such quantities as might be required."

"The use of American money to rebuild plants, to extend operations, to support research, and to meet pay rolls might be a surprise in view of our efforts to establish an industry, but presents nothing alarming."

"But if this money will enable Germany to return to the former practice of long-time credit, occasionally extending over two or three years, then we think the American industry has a perfect right to protest, and that its protest should be heard. All else being equal, the long time credit without interest would be a deciding factor in the market."

"That American money should be used to give this advantage to our strongest competitor is obviously unfair, and the practice should be stopped unless the bankers will even the score by enabling American makers to offer the same privileges."

MAIL THEFTS UNSOLVED

Many Letters to Germany From United States Robbed of Coin.

BERLIN, Jan. 30.—The police are still engaged in attempting to unravel the vast system of mail theft which existed during the Christmas period in Germany. Protests resulted in many postal authorities telling the kickers that the robberies were committed abroad or en route. There have been numerous local prosecutions, but in few cases were there convictions and in practically no cases were there recoveries of stolen mail.
