

WOODRUFF PLACE CALM AS PRIMARY TIME APPROACHES

All It Worries About Is Election of Two New Trustees Next Fall.

Residents of a section within the city, yet not a part of Indianapolis, waste no time worrying over the coming city primary in May.

"Woodruff" Place, a separate corporation, will elect two new trustees to the town board and a clerk-treasurer this fall. Candidates will present a petition bearing twenty or more names of citizens to the town board asking that their names be placed on the ballot. Usually the elections are accompanied with all the rivalry and enthusiasm of a big city election.

Present Trustees

Present members of the board are the Rev. H. T. Graham, 583 East Dr.; Jay Leider, 680 Middle Dr., and A. V. Wilson, 609 West Dr. Term of office of Leider and Wilson will end Jan. 1, 1926.

John M. Dils, town clerk and treasurer, has had the office two terms.

Dils announced that James Mitchell, attorney, had been named to succeed the late W. W. Lowrey, his Woodruff attorney.

Elmer Lusher has been named acting marshal during the illness of George W. Fox, veteran marshal and street commissioner. The town pays the city of Indianapolis \$5,000 a year for fire and police protection.

Although Woodruff Place was laid out in 1871, it has only ten ordinances. The tenth one was passed Feb. 16, 1925, the other nine being enacted in 1900.

Increased automobile traffic made necessary the new ordinance. It provides that all drives be one-way streets, makes unlawful parking more than six hours from 7 p.m. to 8 a.m., unnecessary sounding of automobile horns, and persons while upon roller skates to hold to or hang upon an automobile or other vehicle while in motion. Penalty is a fine of not more than \$10.

GASOLINE PRICES HIGHER, DESPITE BIG PRODUCTION

Federal Officials Threaten to Investigate Situation.

WASHINGTON, March 20.—Despite the biggest month gasoline production has ever had, last December, price of the fuel continues to rise.

This situation has brought a warning from Federal officials that the gasoline situation will be investigated, to see what justification oil companies have, if any, for raising gasoline prices.

But the answer to this comes from one of the large oil companies in the following explanation:

"Crude oil recently has jumped from 15 cents to 50 cents a barrel. A barrel contains forty gallons and makes about twenty gallons of gasoline.

"The advance has been due to a shortage; the shortage to cessation of production, cessation of production to a surplus on hand."

Yet the latest available figures show an increase in production, despite the heavy surplus of oil on hand. During December, Government records show, the output of gasoline amounted to nearly 796,000,000 gallons, against a consumption of a little more than 661,000,000 gallons for that month.

Even with an export of 101,000,000 gallons, there remained a surplus of about 34,000,000 gallons of gasoline.

What has caused the higher price, therefore, has not been lack of gasoline supply, but efforts on the part of producers to cause a shortage by halting production.


