

## BRADY SILENT ON WHISPERED TRACTION DEAL

Refuses to Deny or Affirm  
Report Insult Will Take  
Over U. T.

ANDERSON, Ind., May 1.—Arthur W. Brady, receiver for the Union Traction Company, would neither affirm nor deny rumors current here that his road might be taken over by the Samuel J. Insull interests of Chicago, operators of other electric roads in Indiana, and controllers of electric roads around Chicago and Milwaukee.

**Advantages Shown**  
Such an acquisition, rumors of which have been persistent in certain circles since the receivership was ordered, would give the Insull people control of some of the most important interurban highways in the State.  
They already own the Interstate Public Service Company, operating between Louisville and Indianapolis, the Winona Service Company, between Peru and Goshen, and the Indiana General Service Company, operating a line from Lafayette through Ft. Wayne to Lima, Ohio. In addition, they have lines operating between Chicago and Milwaukee. Acquisition of the Union Traction would give them roads sufficient to operate through electric service for passengers and freight from Louisville to Milwaukee, serving one of the most productive sections in the entire country.

**Inspection Up**  
The rumors received added stimulus when it was unofficially learned that a special train left this city carrying former Governor James P. Goodrich and a party of men, for a preliminary tour over the line. In the party were Brady, receiver; H. A. Nichol, general manager, and Walter Shroyer, secretary treasurer, of the company.  
Brady said the party had nothing to do with the rumored merger, but was a committee representing holders of mortgage bonds of the company, making one of its periodical inspecting tours.

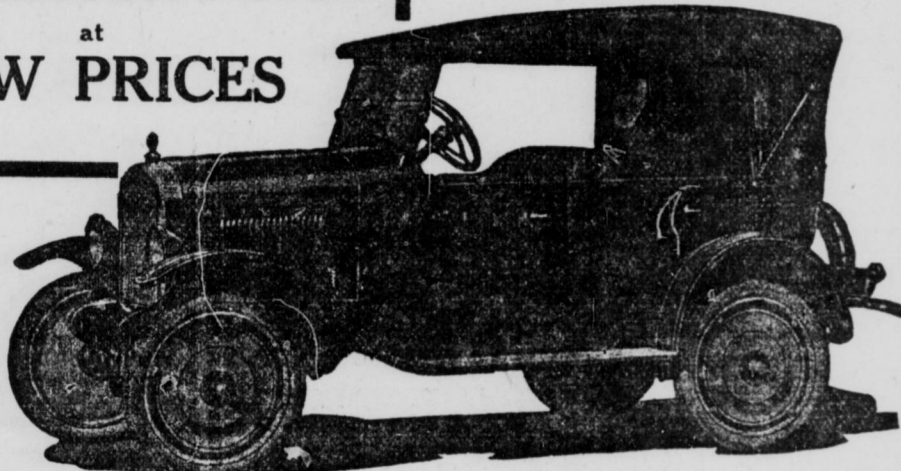
