

## STRIKERS LAY SIEGE TO MINES

Safety Men Forced to Flee  
Posts in Wales.

LONDON, July 30.—Coal miners out on local strikes in Wales early today besieged numerous collieries in the Ammanford Valley.

In six hours after midnight, eight groups of strikers, each four hundred strong and armed with bludgeons, took law into their own hands and forced the "safety men" at the idle mines to retire, according to word from Cardiff. Before the club-armed men, the police were powerless.

With such portentous news at hand, Premier Baldwin began another day's strenuous efforts to prevent the threatened July 31 coal lockout throughout the land.

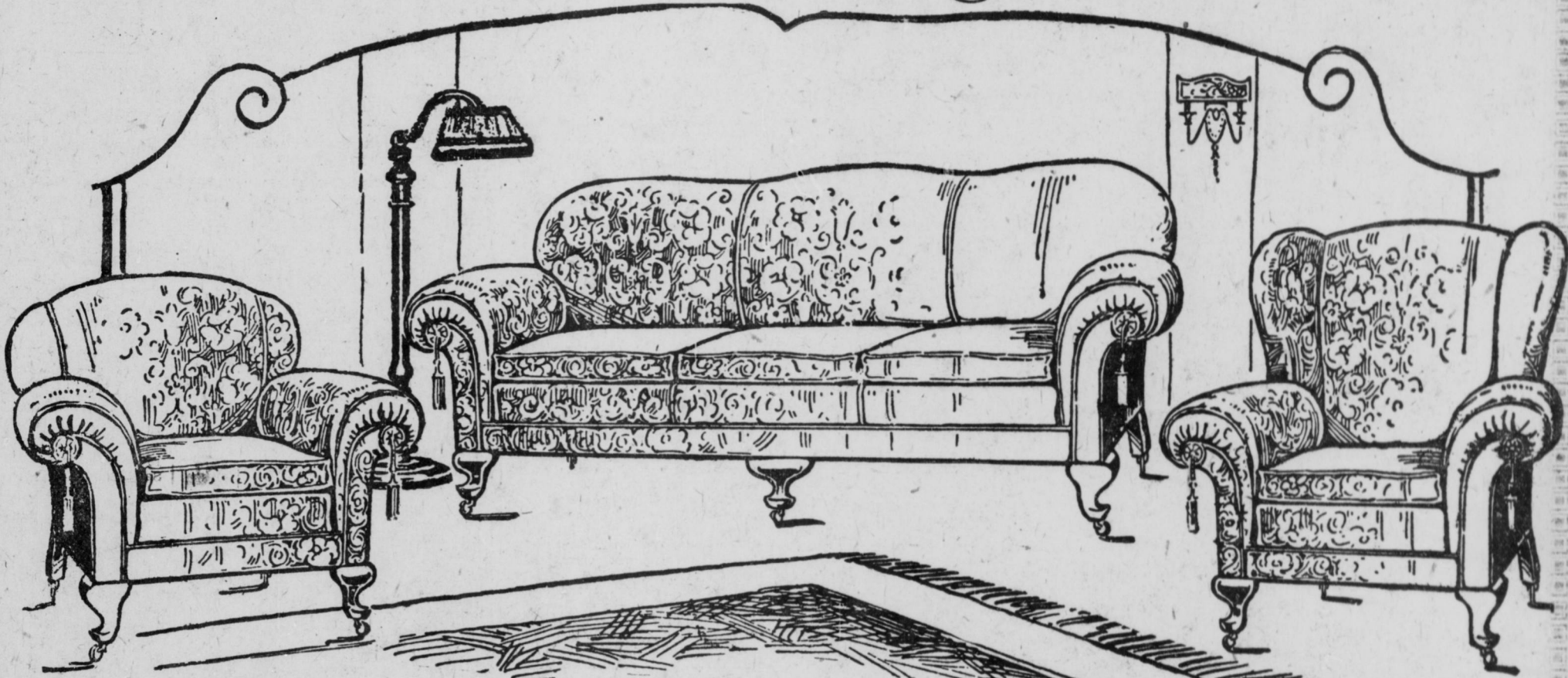
