
### WAR VET CROSSES SEA

**GEN. SHERWOOD DYING**

TOLEDO, Ohio, Oct. 9.—The death of General Isaac Sherwood, 90, oldest living former Congressman within the next two or three days "is inevitable," physicians who have maintained a constant vigil at the aged man's bedside, said today. General Sherwood was recently stricken by anemia.

## SUNNYSIDE IS SHOWN BY FILM

### Work Being Done at Sanatorium Displayed.

Many of the foremost clubs of the city are availing themselves of the opportunity to see the Sunnyside Sanatorium motion picture film, which is being shown under the auspices of the Marion County Tuberculosis Association. The film, taken by Harry Coburn, gives a definite picture of the conditions at Sunnyside that only a personal visit could do otherwise. The institution is partly financed by an appropriation from the county taxes, and several

women's clubs are actively engaged in work for the sanatorium.

The patients, now numbering 180 men, women and children, pay according to their means. Tanned little fellows clad only in shorts, are shown in the picture, romping their way to health in the sunshine. An interesting close-up of life in the cheerful wards is given. The sanatorium has added several new buildings, but these are not yet enough to care for the needs of all the patients who wish to enter there.

Dr. H. S. Hatch, superintendent of the sanatorium, is anxious that the picture be shown before clubs and other organizations so that a fuller knowledge of the work of the sanatorium may be given. Bookings for the picture may be had through the Marion County Tuberculosis As-

sociation, which financed the making of the film through the sale of Red Cross Seals.


