

TO INVESTIGATE COURT SYSTEM

Remy Is Told to Look Into
City Procedure.

Judge James A. Collins today instructed Prosecutor William H. Remy to investigate the system by which persons arraigned in city courts are bound over to the grand jury. This order grew out of the trials of Frank B. Walker, colored, and Joe Ford, in Criminal Court.

It was revealed that both Walker and Ford were serving city court sentences in the county jail on misdemeanors while awaiting trial on grand jury indictments.

Walker was indicted for failure to stop after an accident and Ford for vehicle taking. Walker is serving a city court sentence for improper driving and speeding while Ford is serving a lower court term for drunkenness and improper driving.
