It is a very dangerous crossing and much more so now as they have a vegetable stand in the front yard. A large canvas covering makes it impossible to see west from the north.

Sergt. Edward P. Moore of the police accident prevention bureau has promised Mr. Fixit to take a look at the condition.

DEAR MR. FIXIT: At the north west corner of Meridian and New York Sts., they placed the timer for the automatic signal on red pedestal, the kind they place fire alarm boxes on in the downtown district.

From a distance it looks as if a fire alarm was on that corner, but there isn't any. If a fire would break out near there some one would go to that corner thinking the timer was a fire box. The nearest box is two blocks away, at Meridian and Vermont Sts.

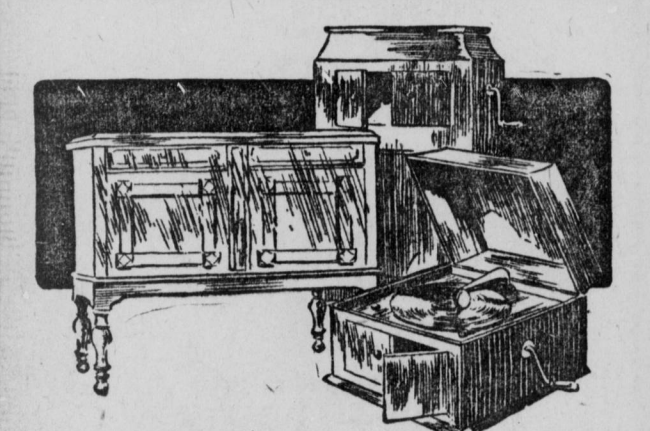
