Figgis' death follows that by eight days of Riga Norris, a young dancing teacher, who declared before she died in a maternity ward of a hospital, that the Irish statesman

was her husband. It also recalled the suicide of his wife who shot herself in a taxicab in the Dublin mountains less than a year ago.
