

M'CRAY'S GOOD BALL PLAYER SAYS REMUS

Millionaire Bootleg King Brings News That Former Indiana Governor Is Healthy in Prison.

Warren T. McCray is a good handball player.

And he is in good health. In fact, he is feeling and looking much more fit since he went to Atlanta than when he left Indianapolis.

McCray, former Indiana Governor, was sentenced to serve ten years in the Federal Penitentiary at Atlanta on charges of using the mails to defraud.

The information concerning his health and handball playing ability came to day from George Remus, millionaire bootleg king, in Indianapolis during the special Federal grand jury session, which is investigating an alleged St. Louis-Indianapolis liquor ring.

Remus was released from the Atlanta Penitentiary Sept. 1, after serving a twenty-one-month term on a liquor conspiracy charge.

"All the boys play handball and

McCray is exceptionally good," Remus said.

"McCray never said much about his parole effort and I wouldn't say anything that would injure his possibilities of getting as far in this move as he could. He is well liked at the prison."

Remus then launched into a bit of philosophy on prison sentences, saying that in some cases men are sufficiently punished with thirty-day sentences, while others have to have it stretched over a period of years.

"The time to smile when you are sentenced to jail is before you go, because once you get there and are on the inside looking out, all your smiles are gone," Remus said.

PAINLEVE GETS NEW CABINET

Briand Remains at Foreign Affairs Post.

PARIS, Oct. 29.—The Painleve cabinet was formed today. Working until almost dawn, snatching a brief rest and then starting on his cabinet formation again this morning, former premier, Paul Painleve, succeeded in forming a cabinet to replace the old Painleve regime, which resigned Tuesday to shake off Finance Minister Caillaux.

In the new cabinet Painleve, premier and finance minister, up to him now devolves the task in which the picturesque Caillaux failed—restoration of France's finances to a state of clarity and health.

Supporting him as before is Aristide Briand in the foreign ministry.

The official cabinet list follows: Painleve, premier and minister of finance; Briand, foreign affairs; Chautemps, justice; Schmeck, interior; Daledair, war; Emil Borel, navy; Delbos, instruction; Durand, agriculture; Durafour, labor; Antier, pensions; Perrier, colonies; Vincent, commerce; De Monzie, public works; Bonnet, budget.

MARKET HAS NOTHING NEW

Prices Are Practically Unchanged on Stands.

Nothing new appeared on the stands of the city market house today and prices were practically unchanged. California tomatoes were lower and sold at 25 cents a pound. Mushrooms were lower also and were selling at 90 cents a pound. Very few turkeys were to be found at 65 cents a pound.

Other prices included alligator pears, 60 cents each; Jonathan and Grimes Golden apples, 3 pounds for 25 cents; California seedless grapes, 2 pounds for 25 cents; Burnside onions, 10 cents each; cabbage, 5 cents a pound; cranberries, 20 cents a pound; persimmons, 20 cents a pound; and green beans, 20 cents a dozen.

Oysters were selling at 70 cents to \$1; ducks, 45 cents a pound; cat fish, 35 cents a pound; white fish, 35 cents a pound; butter, 59 to 60 cents a pound; chickens, 40 cents a pound; eggs, 50 and 55 cents a dozen; Florida oranges, 85 cents a dozen; California oranges, 75 cents a dozen; and lemons 40 to 60 cents a dozen.
