Factory Manager Will Be  
Buried at Muncie.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 p.m. Friday for Grover C. Davis, 41, factory manager of the Stutz Motor Car Company, who died Wednesday at the Methodist Hospital. The services will be at the home of his brother, Alfred N. Davis, Muncie, with burial in the Beech Grove cemetery there.

Mr. Davis made his home at the Indianapolis Athletic Club and had been factory manager of the motor company since November, 1924. He served in the United States Marine Corps in the World War. In 1919 he became associated with the Updike Motor Car Company and later with the Stutz Company.

In addition to his brother he is survived by a nephew, Vernon Davis, also of Muncie.
